- Describing the ideal viewing experience


What we wanted to explore

- More context accessible without need to navigate away from text
- Content that relates to all or part/section of text
- Experiment with different ideas of display
- Use existing information that is hidden
- Work in a browser and tablet world

First results

- A top global menu providing information about whole Act
- Contents on left of screen that can be swiped
- Interactive right hand panel with information about the specific extract being viewed










Need to know - 'show on act' control




Need to know - 'show on act' turned on




Should know – section 2 is only in force for specific purposes




Like to know – text of the commencement order detailing the specific purposes




Should know – 3 sources, inc official EN
