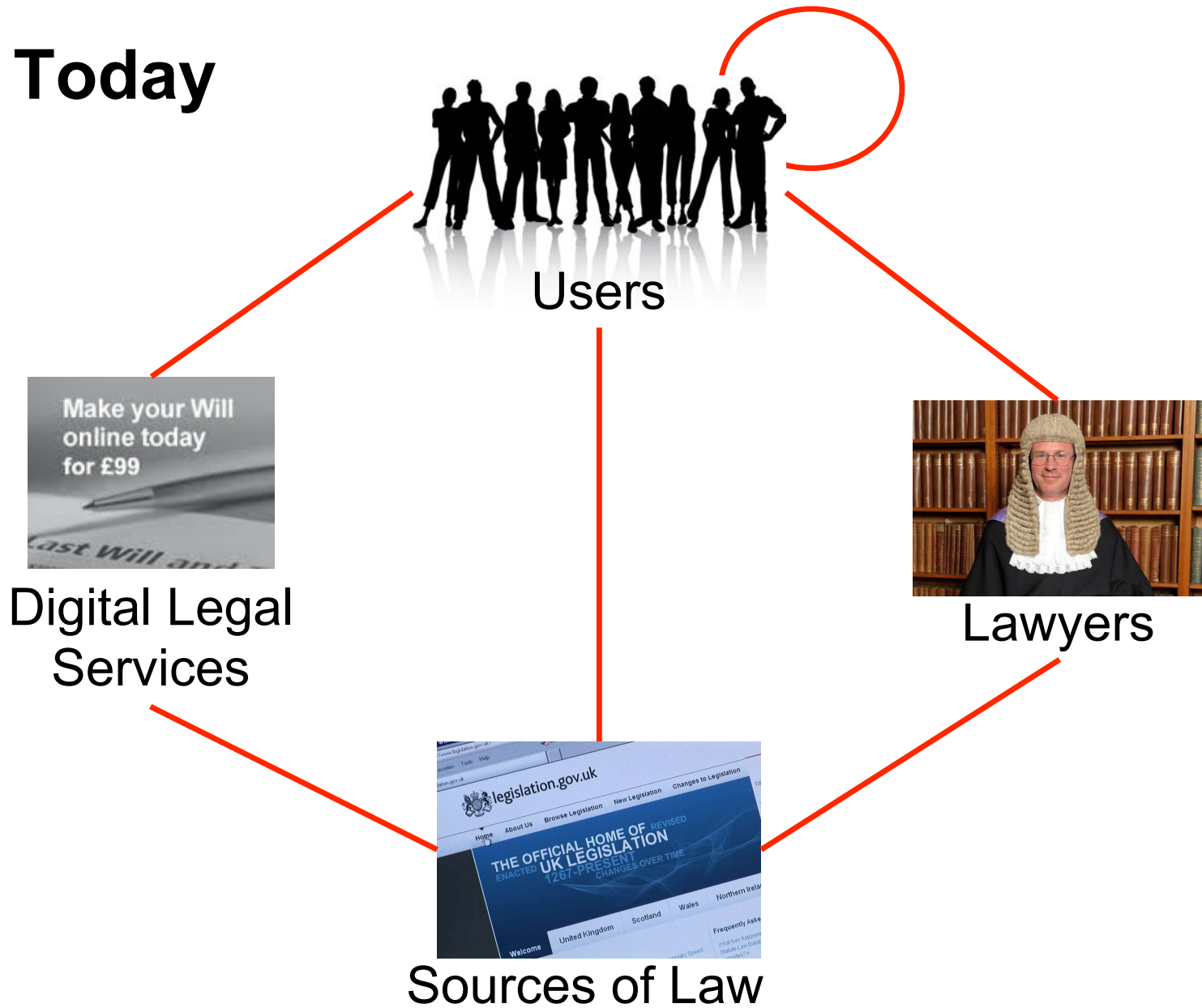

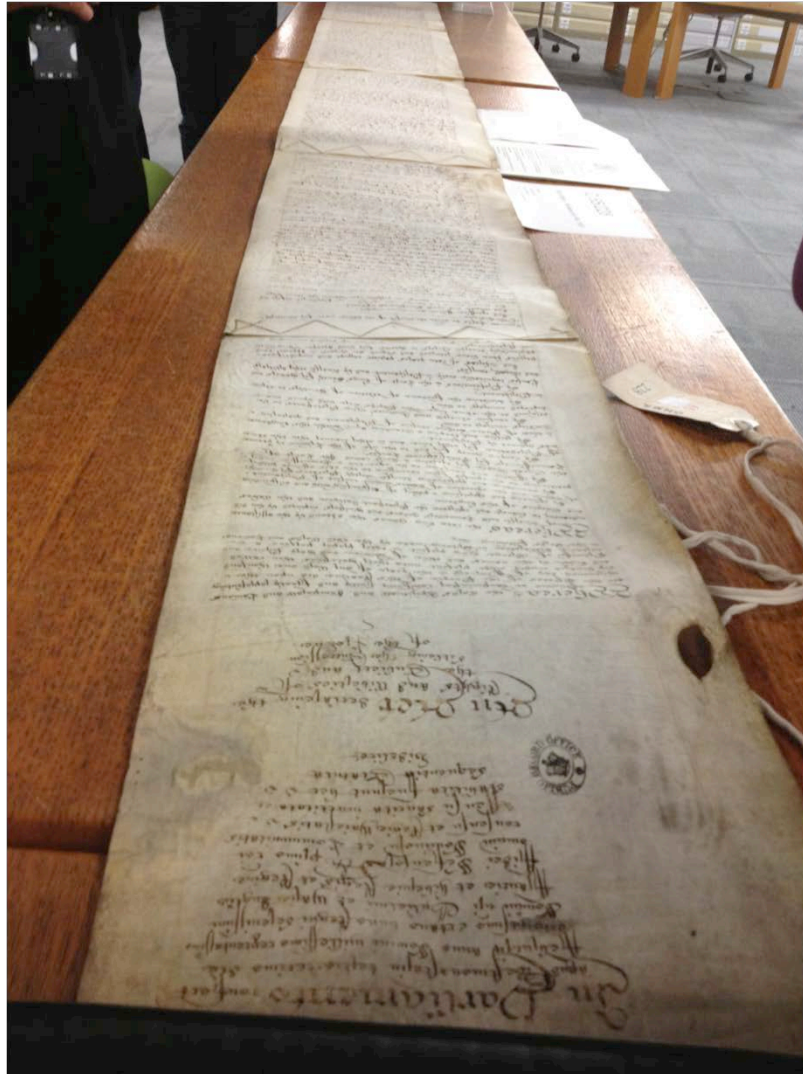
2013 CHAPTER 30

An Act to make provision for the marriage of same sex couples in England and Wales, about gender change by married persons and civil partners, about consular functions in relation to marriage, for the marriage of armed forces personnel overseas, for permitting marriages according to the usages of belief organisations to be solemnized on the authority of certificates of a superintendent registrar, for the review of civil partnership, for the review of survivor benefits under occupational pension schemes, and for connected purposes.

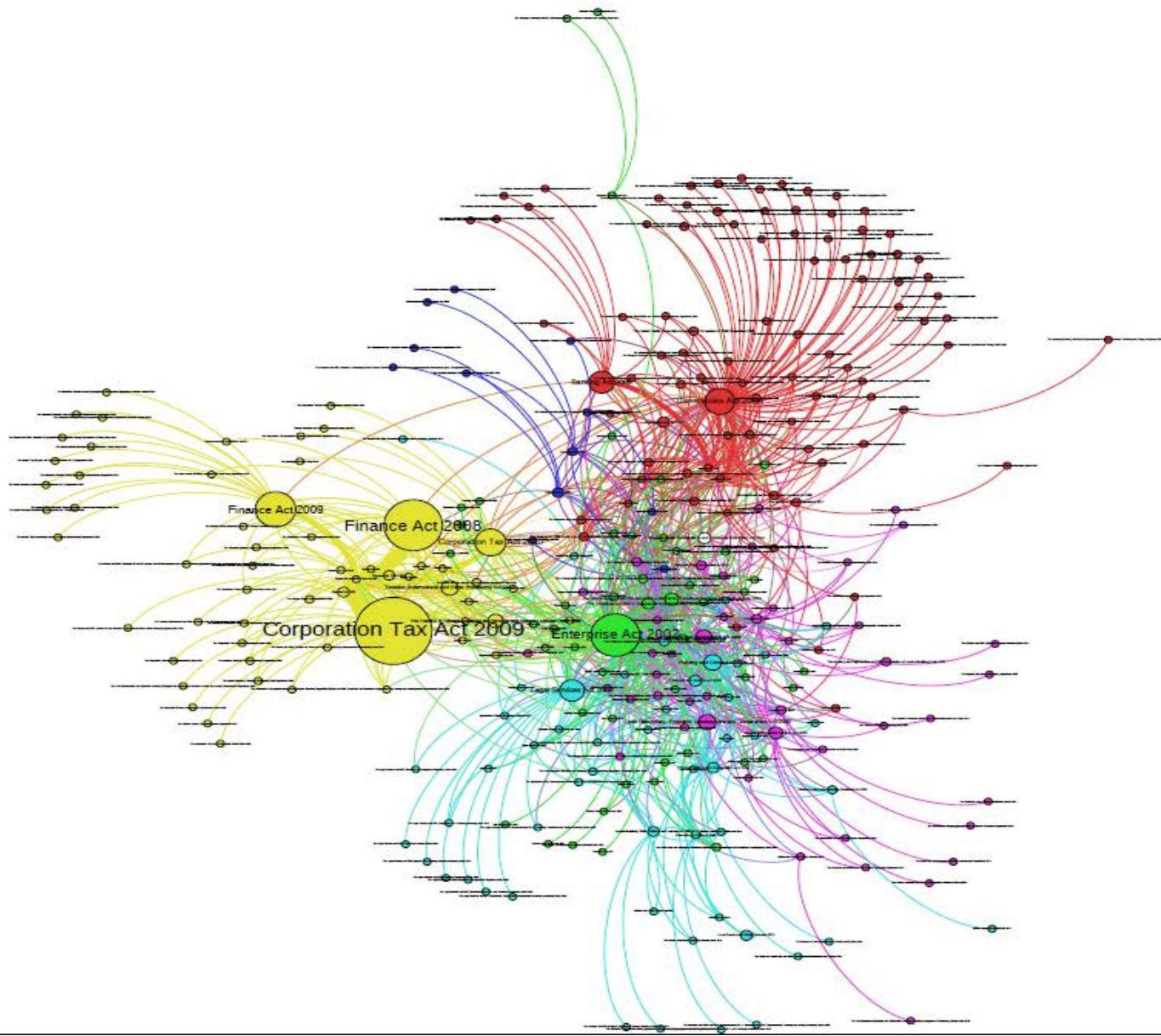

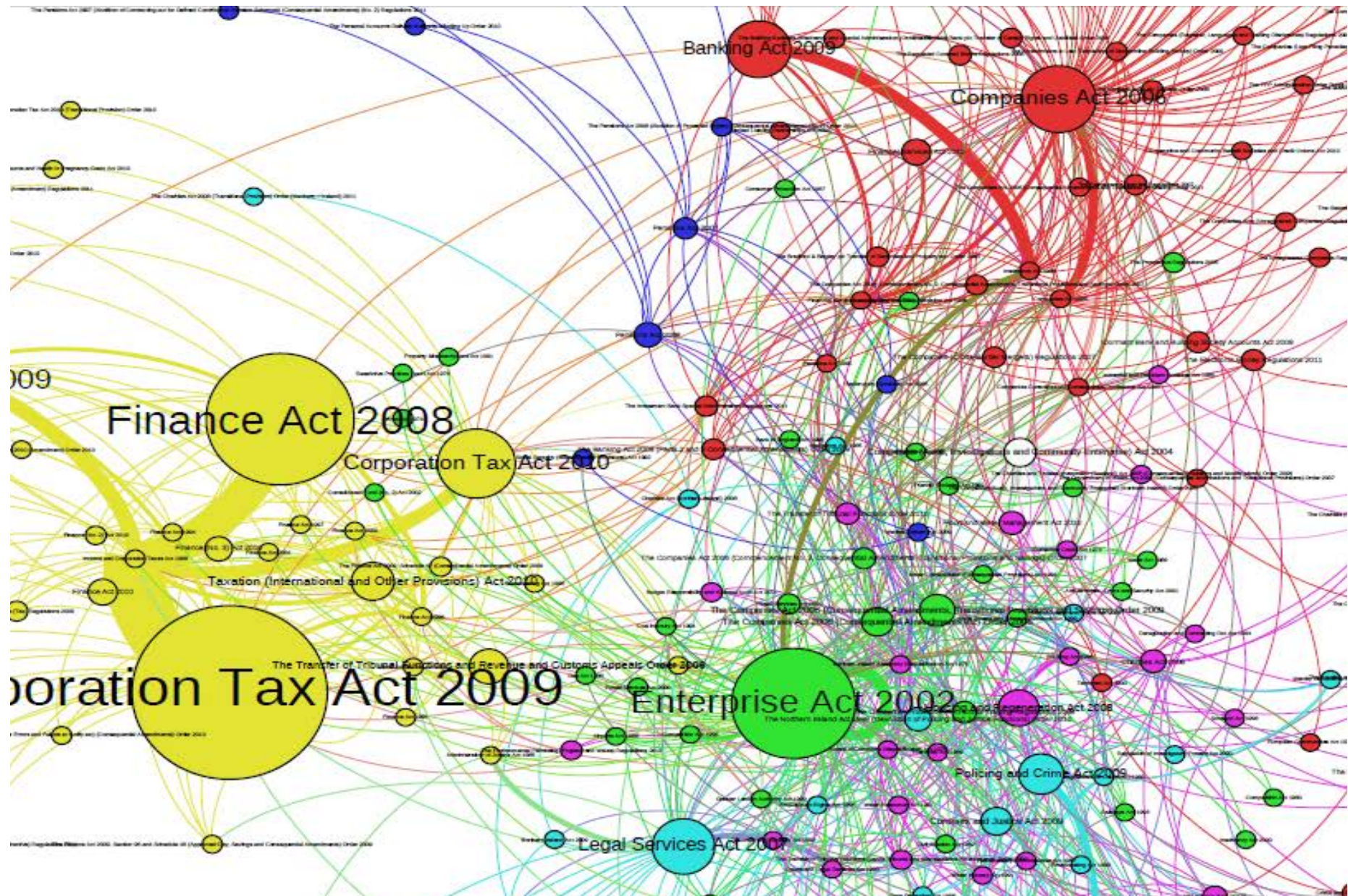

What we wanted to explore



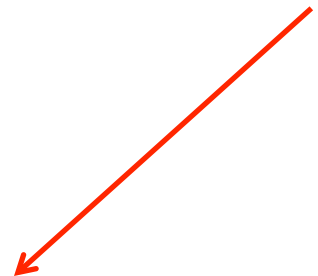

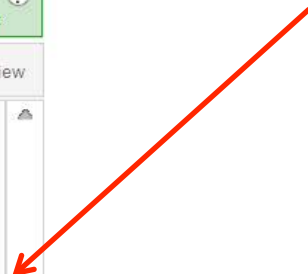
Provisions coming into force on 6th April 2013

2 (1) Part 1 of the 2012 Act comes into force on 6th April 2013, subject to paragraphs (2) to (3).

(2) On 6th April 2013 section 76(1) of the 2012 Act comes into force only so far as it relates to the repeal of the following provisions of Part IV of the 1986 Act—

- (a) section 37(2) to (7), (9) and (10) (Airports subject to economic regulation: requirement for permission to levy airport charges),
- (b) section 38 (Grant or refusal of permissions)

(3) On 6th April 2013 only the following provisions of Schedule 9 (Regulation of operators of

Section 69: Air transport services

- The CAA's primary duty (section 1(1), which governs all of its functions under Chapter 1 of Part 1) is to further the interests of users of air transport services regarding the range, availability, continuity, cost and quality of airport operation services.
- This section defines "air transport service" and "provider" and "user" of such services. Users comprise: current and future passengers of both commercial and private flights; and those with current and future property rights in cargo which is transported by air.
- The definition of users of air transport services does not include airlines, pilots or other members of crew.
