From Placentia, Port aux Basques, and Charlottetown to Halifax/Dartmouth, and right through to Edmundston, special offers and free services for professional drivers from restaurants, hotels, organizations, and truck stops are appearing online and at the roadside. In their own way, they too are providing essential services.

In Quispamsis, one group created an initiative, <u>www.helpatruckernb.ca</u>, to raise \$25,000 and provide 100-150 free hot meals daily to professional drivers. "That's incredible," says Picard.

"When this crisis began and demand for goods across multiple borders intensified, drivers responded by finding solutions and doubling their efforts to ensure safe, timely delivery of critical goods," explains Picard, adding "Atlantic Canadians have big hearts, and the things they're doing to support professional drivers are very much appreciated.
