Your Branch Committee met on Wednesday 22nd May with our VC Cheryl for a convivial discussion of issues facing both the TEU and UC. Cheryl is the first

2019 adjustment to Paid Parental Leave payment rates

The Parental Leave and Employment Protection Act 1987 requires that the parental leave payment rate be adjusted annually on 1 July. The rate for the maximum weekly payment increases in line with the percentage increase for the average ordinary time weekly earnings for employees, while the minimum rate for self-employed persons is adjusted to be equal to 10 hours at the adult minimum wage.

This year, the maximum weekly payment will increase to \$585.80 (gross), due to a 3.8% increase in the average ordinary time weekly earnings for employees. The minimum weekly rate for self-employed persons will increase to \$177.00 (gross), due to the minimum wage increasing to \$17.70 per hour on 1 April 2019.

These new rates will be announced by the Minister for Workplace Relations and Safety and published on employment.govt.nz prior to 1 July.

Academic Freedom

Our last TEU Branch newsletter covered Professor Anne-Marie Brady's Academic Freedom Award. It is pleasing to note that Professor Brady was the subject of a University of Canterbury news release acknowledging the award published on 5th June on the UC website. Entitled Excellence award for UC

<u>political scientist</u>, publication of this article is another indication that UC takes Academic freedom seriously.

Professor Brady has also been asked to comment on National Media on the Chinese Communist Party's influence on New Zealand's media reporting of the recent mega protests in Hong Kong over the proposed extradition law. Professor Brady has confirmed she will address our Branch AGM.
