President's Report 1992

Welcome to the NSWJRU. 36th A.G.M.. Thank you for your support of Junior Rugby in N.S.W. in 1992. The annual report is presented for your consideration.

1992 has been a successful one for NSWJRU both on and off the field.

Administratively, a number of initiatives were taken to move the union forward to meet the challenges of the 90's. Following our involvement in the Waratah Coaching and Development Committee it is planned to create two significant activities at NSWJRU. These are:

- A promotional / sponsorship working group.
- A review working group.

These groups will address two major areas vital to the future developments of our game. The changes brought about through the Development Committee in 1992 need continual evolution.

A grant request has been forwarded to Waratah Rugby for assistance with funding to enable the production of a NSWJRU handbook, an important aspect of our communications network.

The Code of Ethics, produced in early 1991, has recently been updated and reprinted. This Code plays a significant role in our game. How we behave both on and off the game is a critical element of Rugby. The co-operation commenced in 1991, between the Australian and NSWJRU's and Schools Rugby was developed further in 1992. Co-ordination of a number of dates was achieved and for the first time NSWJRU 1st XV (U17) played CHS. Further fostering of this relationship is essential for the future.

A number of promotional and development activities were undertaken by member union's during the year. These together with the World Cup, and TV coverage and promotion have seen significant growth in player numbers in 1992.

Recently released figures reveal an increase of 21.9% in playing numbers at Junior level in 1992 across Australia. Country JRU are to be congratulated on the creation of the Riverina Zone, a new Rugby area that has not been involved in recent times. Our thanks are also extended to the significant numbers of Waratahs and Wallabies who gave freely of their time to be involved in Junior promotion days.

June long weekend again saw the NSWJRU championships. Our thanks are extended to Sydney JRU and branch unions, Easts/Randwick, Gordon, Eastwood, Parramatta and Drummoyne for the conduct of the events. Your support and co-operation is greatly appreciated.

Over two thousand people turned out to watch the day. Goes to show " Junior Rugby " is a goer.



A.C.T. JUNIOR RUGBY UNION INCORPORATED.

The 1992 Junior Rugby season was a challenging year administratively. The standard of play on the field was high, however a noticable decline in individual skills was noted. This area needs to be addressed if the standard of the game is to advance in the A.C.T.

Our representative teams met with mixed success, our Under 18 team won the N.S.W.J.R.U. State Championship. Our Under 12 and 14 sides were finalists at the N.S.W.R.U. State Championships. The Under 16 National Championships was held in Melbourne and the A.C.T. side performed above expectations.

The season got under way on 4/5 April with our now familiar pre-season competition. Nominations was again down this year, particularly the number of school teams that participated. The conducting of this competition before the school holidays proved successful. The competition proper got under way on 2 May, 1992 and was played over 12 rounds with the shortened final series, except for the Under 18's who played 15 rounds. The Grand Finals were again played at Phillip District Ovals and again this move proved highly successful as we were able to play all games at the one complex.

This year two Level 1 Coaching Courses were conducted for 59 members. All participants commented on the benefit gained by their attendance. Coaching is an area where continued development is needed as it has been noted that the technical skills and training methods of some need revision to address the decline in player skills.

This year was again difficult to provide referees for all games, particularly the Junior age groups. A real effort is required to encourage former players and older junior players to take up refereeing. This will be particularly important if the Junior Pathway is adopted and proven successful.

This year the A.C.T. Junior Rugby Union devoted two meetings to discussing the Australian Rugby Football Union's proposal for the development of Junior Rugby called "Junior Rugby Pathway" and this matter will be further discussed at the Annual General Meeting.

Any Discussion on this matter is not easy as the issue is not a simple one. The A.C.T. will continue to minister development in this area in Sydney and Queensland as it is believed important that the major unions keep in step, however, it is felt that this approach may provide some assistance in the development of the game in the junior age groups as it soes come to grips with current community expectations for junior sport.

1992 has seen a year of good performances by our representative teams. The Under 16's played with limited success in the Australian Championship in Melbourne. Although outsized and playing in atrocious conditions the team improved with every game and the players benefited from the experience. The following players were selected to play in the Australian Under 16 side which was defeated 15-3 by New Zealand in Adelaide in September:

The following players were selected in the President's XV which played a warm up game against the visiting New Zealand side in Sydney:

Kai Browlie (St. Edmunds) and Greg Convery (St. Patricks).

The Under 12's, 14's and 18's all contested the finals of the N.S.W. State Championship.

The Under 18 side also played games against Riverina, Sydney and Victoria. The evenness of this year's Under 18 competition was pleasing.

The A.C.T. has continued to support a Colts competition which provides an ideal transition for our younger players to Grade football.

Congratulations to all players who made the Gold and Black representing Country Juniors in our three age divisions.The reports will acknowledge the outstanding successes and our disappointments.I thank all the team Officials for their enthusiasm and work with our players throughout the season.

It is pleasing to welcome Riverina and North Coast back to the ranks after many years absence.This is a good sign,but much still needs to be done in expansion of zones.

The really effective push throughout the year has been in Development.I must personally thank,Vice President Phil Eather for his continued and untiring support in this respect.Phil and I travelled to many meetings in Sydney and I am optimistic that Country Juniors will benefit in the long run.Waratah and Country Seniors are very much informed on our needs for full time development officers in order that we can compete with other sports.I do hope that zones can see their way to trial the new Pathways plan for Junior programmes in the new season.Bob Bradley and Warren Robilliard will give you more information at this meeting.

The one really worrying problem is our Constitution update and Incorporation.Unfortunately we have not heard from Rick Buckley who volunteered to work on this,but we must take up the matter as urgently as possible and get it all cleared up.We will be looking for someone to make it their job for 1993.

Once again I thank my family who have been such a tower of strength over a very busy year.Thanks to you all who have put your blood ,sweat and tears into the effort.

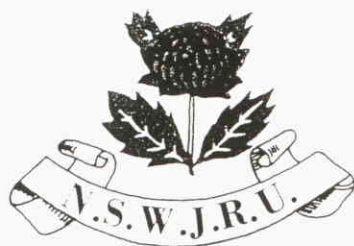

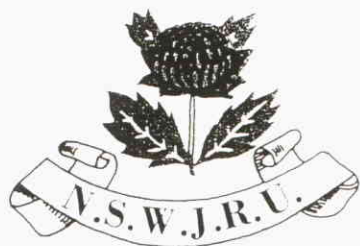
The Treasurer advised that he had transfered

Cleal guides State side to third title

A FEELING of déjà vu would have washed over Orange rugby coach Dave Cleal when his NSW under 17 side toppled Queensland 22-11 at Sydney's Warringah Rugby Park on Sunday.

Not only was it Cleal's third consecutive year as the successful NSW under 17 coach but the game followed an almost identical pattern to Saturday's Sydney first grade rugby grand final, where Cleal and his players were guests.

Like Randwick in the first grade grand final, NSW under 17s ran into a stiff head wind and like Randwick could manage just three first half points to trail at the break.

Randwick came back from a 14-3 half time deficit to humble Gordon three tries to one and NSW under 17s came back from 11-3 at the break to beat Queensland three tries to one.

"I thought we'd be lacking a bit of combination in the first half so we decided to run into the breeze and make holding them a priority," said Cleal.

"They scored a soft try from a lineout right on our line and we were a bit down heartened at the break but we came back to win the second half 19-0."

Talented captain Chris Mandelitis played a starring role scoring a try to lead the side by

example.

"He's a monster, a real good player," said Cleal, mentioning that he was likely to pursue a league career.

Other tries to Danny Dixon and Thai Glassie in the second half completed the success with centre Evan Jones adding two conversions and a penalty goal.

Cleal has been at the team's helm since the Junior Rugby Union state under 17 fixtures began four years ago and has helped NSW dominate the competition.

Queensland took honours in 1989-16-13 but NSW has won the last three.

"It was a good win, especially considering we lost three playes to the GPS side who were pushing a spot with the Australian schoolboy side in Melbourne," said Cleal.

For most of the players their next chance to compete at State level will be with the NSW under 19s, which is classified a senior level.

"There are certainly a few that could do that, three of them made the Australian under 16s last year," said Cleal.

There is no Australian under 17 side chosen.

THE NSW under 17 rugby union side will carry the memory of teammate and star inside centre Danny Bell onto the Warringah Rugby Park when it clashes with Queensland this Sunday.

Bell, a standout in the NSW side, was tragically killed recently after falling from a moving train in Sydney.

He had emerged as one of Australia's leading junior rugby players and been approached by Winfield Cup rugby league clubs St George and Cronulla before the accident.

Bell was a favourite to captain the NSW under 17's, who spent the weekend in Orange with coach Dave Cleal in preparation for next Sunday's game.

As guests of Orange Emus at the club's presentation dinner on Saturday night, the NSW side paid tribute to Bell.

Captain Evan Jones mentioned that the team had lost one of its stars but added that the side was looking forward to representing him when they play Queensland.

His number 12 jumper will be rested and presented to his parents before the game.

Training sessions at Endeavour Oval on Saturday and Sunday concentrated mainly on fitness as the squad will refine further in a training camp in Sydney on Friday and Saturday.

It was the second time in a few months that the under 17's had used Endeavour Oval, as the City-Country trial to select the NSW team was also played in Orange.

The 22-man NSW squad will be special guests at the Sydney first grade grand final at Concord Oval on Saturday before featuring at Warringah on Sunday.

The match will be Queensland's first on a 16 match tour of Argentina and will cap a day also involving games between North Harbour and South Harbour, and the Australian President's and the All Blacks under 16 sides.

The NSW-Queensland game will be used to select the Australian under 17 side.
