### LEARNING TO

Through our creative curriculum and inspirational teaching, we compel children to be curious about the world. There is a strong work ethic and high expectation at The Downs and each child is encouraged to stretch the boundaries of his or her individual abilities. Our children develop their skills of study and come to understand their preferred learning styles. They gain a strong understanding of collaboration and they are guided and encouraged to extend their knowledge and to learn independently.

The learning process is augmented by excellent teaching facilities and small classes. The balance between the use of modern technology and more traditional methods is carefully and constantly evaluated to ensure learning is as effective and engaging as possible. For the younger children our immediate outdoor environment is a unique, invaluable resource to extend learning out of the classroom and beyond the syllabus. Sport is an integral part of each child's development at The Downs. We are aware that there are children, who aren't interested in organized team-sports and for them there is the Downs Award Scheme, an exciting programme of climbing, caving and orienteering not unlike the Duke of Edinburgh's Award.

We enjoy a national reputation for excellence on the games field although we are as proud of our inclusivity as we are of the standard of achievement. Our teams play in the 'premier league' and the impressive results of all the teams speak for themselves. We have regularly won the national rugby sevens title but importantly our teams in various other sports – hockey, netball, horse riding – regularly compete at a similar level. The major sports for boys are rugby, hockey and cricket; for girls, hockey, netball and cricket. The minor sports include swimming, lacrosse, horse riding, tennis, cross country running and athletics. Pupils are able to enjoy these activities in superb facilities that include two Astro-Turf pitches, extensive rugby and cricket fields, two all-weather netball courts, an outdoor, heated swimming pool, and an excellent, modern Sports Hall that houses four full-length indoor cricket nets.

### Community

The warmth of community is a distinguishing feature of The Downs. It is a happy place; a wonderful, close supportive community, full of goodwill. We make it our duty to know each child very well and to embrace parents in partnership to educate their children.

We are mindful of our good fortune; service to others has always been important. We work particularly closely with and for our neighbours, the Children's Hospice South West, and support other local charities. Further afield, we enjoy active and constructive relations with international schools and charities.

The values at the heart of the school are Christian principles. This spirituality provides the backbone of the community but we are nevertheless very pleased to embrace children from other denominations and religions; indeed there is much we can learn from them.



#### **RESULTS & DESTINATIONS**

Pupils move on from The Downs at 13 to a variety of prestigious senior schools. Much time is taken with parents to carefully identify the school most suitable for their children, our advice being entirely impartial given the independent status of the school. The process is evidently successful given that almost without exception our pupils have successfully passed into the school of their first choice over the last decade. We take pride that many of our Year 8 leavers are awarded scholarships; however, such accolade is not purposefully sought as we do not 'hot house' for results. It has been gratifying that on a number of occasions in recent years our pupils have achieved a 'full house' of scholarships in one year; academic, music, art, drama, sport. There can be little more a school can do to provide evidence of genuine breadth.

### Why The Downs Preparatory School?

We are often asked what distinguishes The Downs from other schools. As do a minority of others, we enjoy an outstanding ISI Inspection Report, but this does not necessarily highlight how the school might differ from others.

Most obviously we enjoy a wonderful setting: of 60 acres of stunning parkland and woodland. Not enough to simply admire it's glory, continually we use this wonderful landscape to enhance the children's development and wellbeing.

Put very simply our children are extremely happy; they hugely enjoy school. They are undoubtedly challenged – in all areas – and importantly they experience disappointment. In doing so however, they are confident of exceptional Pastoral Care, an integral network of 'TLC' that the children can rely on when the going gets a little tough. Indeed the responsibility, increasing independence and subtle privilege that inevitably informs the development of their character.

Many schools boast an all-round education but very few provide the range and depth of opportunities our children are fortunate to enjoy. They are young and we guard against

them becoming specialists; rather we embrace inclusion. Within this environment of diverse opportunities our children become confident, self-assured, rounded individuals who value the difference of others.

And then there is the 'big fish in a small bowl' factor: Years 7 and 8 is an excellent reason why pupils should attend The Downs. It is these two year groups, a tender time in the physiological development of young people, that our pupils are the 'biggest fish' in the pond, top of the pile, albeit small. The self-esteem and confidence they develop from this experience is tangible and unique in the local market. Each pupil experiences considerable responsibility, increasing independence and subtle privilege that inevitably informs the development of their character.

An independent Prep School, The Downs does not feed any particular senior school. Over the last decade, our children have moved on to numerous schools including the best and most demanding in the country. Considerable time is taken to provide constructive and objective advice to parents. This consultative process is evidently successful as it is extremely unusual for a pupil not to gain entry into a senior school of their first choice. A large number of Year 8 pupils are awarded scholarships.

Finally 'Why The Downs'? Because we nurture exceptional, happy children of natural grace and unaffected manner.
