

JAS Forwarding (Miami) Host Canine Screening Demo

In November 2018, The Transportation Security Administration (TSA) announced the opportunity for explosive detection canine teams to become registered Third Party Canine (3PK9) Security Program holders under the Certified Cargo Screening Program-K9. This program allows airlines and freight forwarders to utilize private sector canine teams as a primary screening method, essentially reducing time and cost compared to other screening procedures. The use of certified canines eliminate the need to break down palletized cargo, reduces turnaround times to meet airline deadlines, and provides a dependable screening method to process all types of freight.

Whether a loading dock, aircraft, warehouse, or Unit Load Device (UDL), canines are specifically trained to quickly assess any and all areas for potential explosive threats without business disruption. Canines have proven to be the most effective means to screen shipments comprised of multiple commodities, and in some cases (e.g. drums, perishable products) they are the only means available.

JAS Forwarding (Miami) has been a CCSF (Certified Cargo Screening Facility) since January 11th 2010 and currently utilizes ETD technology as its primary screening method. Upon deployment of the 3PK9 Program, JAS Miami was pleased to have MSA Security out for a live demo of their canine screening process and looks forward to utilizing this screening method in the near future.
