Re: UPDATE – ICAO All-Cargo 100% Screening Mandate June 2021

Dear Valued Client,

On September 1, 2016 the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) notified the air cargo industry that effective June 30, 2021, international standards will require all air cargo carried by commercial aircraft operators be screened or have commensurate security measures applied.

A 100% requirement for screening of cargo transported on passenger air carriers departing and arriving US airports has been in effect since August 2010. Since TSA's implementation of the Certified Cargo Screening Program (CCSP), freight forwarders, airlines, independent screening facilities and shippers continue to successfully meet this mandate with extreme efficiency and effectiveness. This program continues to be a successful foundation of passenger cargo security in the United States due to the most recent 3PK9 Program along with other certified technologies that help perform screening with no significant disruption in service levels.

JAS Forwarding (USA) has long been a member of TSA's Certified Cargo Screening Program and currently has CCSF (Certified Cargo Screening Facility) located in all major gateways. While the June 2021 deadline may bring a challenge to the industry, JAS feels confident and ready for this mandate due to our multiple methods of screening and numerous years of experience in the CCSP. Additionally, many U.S. based all-cargo aircraft operators currently require screening prior to departure. Therefore, JAS is already screening that portion of cargo, and over the coming months, will steadily increase that sum to ensure readiness for the new mandate as it nears.
