VISION

The Archbishops' Young Leaders Award is a fully resourced leadership and personal effectiveness programme designed to both enhance and form part of a school's curriculum. It offers an exciting opportunity for your learners to:

- Engage in new learning experiences
- Grow in leadership and develop skills integral to the four purposes of the Curriculum for Wales,
- Discover the benefits of helping others



LEARNING

All teaching materials and resources are provided to allow learners to:

- Explore and identify their leadership skills, further develop skills integral to the four purposes of the Curriculum for Wales and develop an understanding of the importance of serving others
- Investigate the stories and impact of great leaders in society
- Examine the role they can play to lead positive change in their communities, supporting and looking after the most vulnerable
- Develop the skills required to lead others and work effectively in a team

Our Award is achievable for all and offers learners a wide range of social, personal and educational benefits.

LEADERSHIP

Develops core Leadership skills including team work, communication, negotiation, creative thinking and initiative. Provides practical opportunities for learners to practise implementing these skills.

VALUES

Nurtures core values, such as compassion, humility, and self-control. Provides opportunities for embedding these values in daily life and school culture.

GROWTH MINDSET

Inspires independent learning, helping shape future aspirations and development of skills for life. Fosters a 'can do' attitude.

PERSONAL WELLBEING

Encourages self-awareness and emotional intelligence. Increases learners' levels of confidence, resilience and empathy.

MOTIVATIONAL FOUNDATION

Cultivates a mind-set for helping others through volunteering and practical action. Many learners continue their efforts beyond the life of the Award.

Encourages justice and concern for others; promotes tolerance and respect; fosters cynefin and breaks down barriers in our communities. Learner actions help positively raise your school profile within the community.

How does it work?



ACCESSIBLE FOR ALL SCHOOLS

A diverse range of school settings run the Award, both schools of a religious character and local authority schools



HOW IS IT DELIVERED?

The resources are flexible and open ended and can fit into a variety of delivery models. The majority of our schools embed the Award into their curriculum.



TIMESCALE

We recommend at least a term, but many of our schools choose to run the Award over two terms or the whole academic year.



CURRICULUM LINKS

The Award clearly supports the four purposes of the Curriculum for Wales, particularly through its skills and experiences approach, as well as many other cross curricular links that can be made.



WHICH YEAR GROUP?

The Award can work well with any group between Years 4 and 6. We have found that Years 4 and 5 are very popular with our schools.



ALTERNATIVE DELIVERY

Some schools successfully run the Award after school. This requires commitment from those delivering and attending.



MEET ARCHIE BISHOP!

Through a series of animated videos, learners follow Archie's story as he learns to be a leader and becomes passionate about helping others.

He sets learners challenges throughout the Award that help them put their learning into action.

LAUNCH ASSEMBLY

The Award starts with a Launch Assembly which introduces Archie Bishop and helps the learners to begin to think about how they can 'be the change they want to see'.

CERTIFICATES


At the end of the award a small sample of evidence from learners' scrapbooks can be uploaded through the digital AYLA platform. Learners are then awarded individual certificates.


