

BOOKS

The GreatBooks

Wednesday, June 18th at 7:30pm

Our discussion for June is *The Daughters of the Late Colonel* by Katherine Mansfield (1888-1923). Born in Wellington, New Zealand, the third daughter of a prominent banker, she attended Wellington College for Girls before entering Queen's College in London in 1903. She took cello lessons at the Royal Academy of Music, but returned to New Zealand to pursue a career in writing in 1906.

The Daughters of the Late Colonel was written and first published in 1922. It is a subtle short story about two daughters of the late colonel who are left with the task of preparing his funeral and getting on with their lives after the tragic event of their father's death. The two women had come to rely on their father for their every need. Unlike characters like Jane Eyre, who is a strong woman ready to break through the sexual barrier and prove that women are equal to men, the "daughters" lack power and conviction.

This is the story of two lives distorted by a tyrannical father. It is not only a story of the lost opportunities in the lives of two women, in the literal sense, it is a story of a deprived existence, both physical and mental. This short story exemplifies the theme that individual thinking is a key factor to a rich life.

A collection of Katherine's stories, In a German Pension, was published in 1911. Her memoirs, collected in a book entitled Bliss, secured her reputation as a writer. Followed by her acclaimed Garden Party and Other Stories, her lyrical style and stream of consciousness method, placed her alongside James Joyce and Virginia Woolf. She died in 1923 at the Gurdjieff Institute for the Harmonic Development of Man at Fontainebleau.



30th ANNUAL BLOOMSDAY CELEBRATION

This month READINGS by WRITERS is dedicated to the memory of the late great DONAL HEFFERNAN who, in the early 1970s, organized the first official Saint Paul Bloomsday.

The Bloomsday Society celebrates James Joyce and his brilliant novel *Ulysses*, which took place on one day—
June 16th, 1904, in Dublin.

Now in its sixteenth year, FREE and open to the public, Readings by Writers is hosted by St. Paul Poet Laureate *CAROL CONNOLLY*. The program presents interesting new authors, poets, and their work in this ongoing program which is sponsored by Public Art Saint Paul/Everyday Poems for City Sidewalk.

MIKE FARICY, St. Paul freelance journalist, author, and bagpipe player with Brian Boru Irish Pipe Ban, will play the pipes at the open and close.

FRANKLIN KNOLL, poet and lawyer, served for eighteen years as a Hennepin County District Court Judge. There he observed people under every form of significant stress, often the result of extreme violence—some were victims, some were perpetrators. Human pain almost always played a part. Knoll's poems grow from his experience, including his Zumbrota Crossings Poet Artist Collaboration 2014 prize-winning poem **SWIFT YELLOW BIRD**.





MICHAEL MOOS, poet, holds awards from the NEA: Loft McKnight; Minnesota State Arts Board, and has an MFA in poetry from Columbia University. He has been a writer-in-residence for the Academy of Poets; O'Neill Theatre Center; National Theatre of the Deaf; and has been a writer-in-residence at several Midwestern Art Councils, documented in the NEA in two films.

Moos is perhaps best known for his dog poems included in the anthology **DOG MUSIC**, Saint Martin's Press, and the anthology **BARK**, Bullfinch Press.

MATT McCONNELL, poet, graduate of St. Mary's University n Winona, and the University of Minnesota, taught English and philosophy at Rochester Community College. He directed plays at Edyth Bush Theater in Saint Paul, and acted in many plays at the Rochester Civic Theatre. His book of poems and stories is DOES THE SKY GO ON FOREVER. Matt is currently working on another book. Gene Bjorklun will read Mr. McConnell's work.



MOLLY CULLIGAN, poet and actor. Everyday on this immortal day, Bloomsday, as she is wont to do, Molly, who grew up down the way, and surprised everyone when she bloomed into an actress with a repertory of one person plays and her own poetry. For us, Molly presents Molly Bloom's soliloquy from James Joyce immortal Irish masterpiece **ULYSSES**.

JIM ROGERS, lifelong resident of Saint Paul, is director of the Center for Irish Studies at the University of St. Thomas. Jim has written widely on Irish-American literature, and is also a creative writer. Two of his essays have been listed as "notables" in BEST AMERICAN ESSAYS, His poetry has appeared in numerous publications, including NIMROD; SPIRITUS; and POETRY EAST, and have been read on Garrison Keillor's ALMANAC.



His new book **NORTHERN ORCHARDS: Places Near the Dead,** which has already received notice, is a collection of essays and poems about cemeteries, North Star Press.

CULLEN BATLEY BURNS, poet, lives in Minneapolis and Sturgeon Lake, Minnesota. She is the author of two books of poems, **SLIP** and **PAPER BOAT**, both finalists for a Minnesota Book Award. Her poems appeared in **RATTLE**; **DENVER QUARTERLY**, **THE AMPERSAND REVIEW**, and many other publications.



Cullen teaches English at Century College and keeps bees—whose honey has earned ribbons at the Minnesota State Fair—at her farm up north.

KATE GREEN, poet, widely published Minnesota Book Award-winning writer, will read from her new book of poems, **TOURIST IN THE PURE LAND**. She has twice been granted Poetry Fellowships from the Bush Foundation.



Her mystery novel **SHATTERED MOON** was nominated for an Edgar Allan Poe Award from the Mystery Writers of America.

CARY WATERMAN, poet, is the author of five books of poems. Her most recent book, BOOK OF FIRE, was a Midwest Book Award finalist. There are times when readers of THE LOOKOUT publication pose questions concerning membership in the Investment Club. Here's the skinny.

ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE. The Club is a partnership organized under applicable Minnesota statutes. It has a written partnership agreement which governs its business activities. It has no by-laws, but they are permitted if needed to guide business activities.

MEETING DATES, TIMES, AND PLACE. All meetings are scheduled on the second Wednesday of every month. Start time is 5:30 PM. Adjournment is 7:00 PM. We meet in the second floor library.

DUES, FEES, AND OTHER EXCISES. Start up fee is \$150. This amount is really not a fee but the initial deposit to "jump-start" a new partner's account. Monthly dues (deposit to partner's account) is \$25.00. The National Association of Investment Clubs sponsors a monthly magazine which it charges \$36 per year. This is an optional choice for any member. No "arm-twisting" on this one.

MEMBER PARTICIPATION. Every member is urged to select a company within the Club's portfolio or "Watch-List". And discuss any current news, changes to the company's financial status, or any issues which may be help-full in making decisions to buy, hold, or sell a security.

VOTING RIGHTS. Members have a single vote on all business decisions regardless of amount of partnership ownership.

PROFIT SHARING. Profits/losses/income/expenses are shared proportionately according to each member's partnership percentage ownership.

INVESTMENT STRATEGIES

- Seek companies that have the potential to grow (revenues and earnings) 15% annually
- Manage risk--diversify portfolio over market sectors and market capitalization
- Review portfolio investments monthly
- Limit investment activities (buying and selling stocks) to established stock exchanges
- · Harvest gains and recognize losses when advantageous

The ICLUB membership is open to all who have an interest in in gaining knowledge in the mechanics of stock investments. Guests are always welcome.

The G.K. CHESTERTON SOCIETY

The Everlasting Man By G.K. Chesterton

Tuesday, June 24th at 7pm

G.K. Chesterton (1874-1936)

In June, we'll continue our discussion of *The Everlasting Man* by G. K. Chesterton. *The Everlasting Man* is a Christian apologetics book. Published in 1925, it is to some extent a deliberate rebuttal of H.G. Wells' *The Outline of History*, disputing Wells' portrayals of human life and civilization as a seamless development from animal life and of Jesus Christ as merely another charismatic figure. Whereas *Orthodoxy* detailed Chesterton's own spiritual journey, in this book, he tries to illustrate the spiritual journey of humanity, or at least of Western civilization.

G.K. Chesterton, prolific English critic, wrote around 80 books, several hundred poems, 200 short stories, 4000 essays and a few plays. He was a literary and social critic, historian, playwright, novelist, Catholic Christian theologian and apologist, debater and mystery writer. In addition to the *Daily News* and *The Illustrated London News*, he had his own paper, *G.K.s Weekly*; and he also wrote articles for the *Encyclopedia Britannica*.

Chesterton was, with George Bernard Shaw, Hilaire Belloc, and H.G. Wells, among the big Edwardian men of letters. Chesterton was a master essayist. The only problem with his essays is that there are too many of them. Over five thousand!


