IMPORTANT EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULEBOOK AND WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH

ENTRIES CLOSE MAY 10th, 2023

All entries postmarked after May 10th, 2023 will be subject to a late fee of \$30.00 per horse. Entries received after May 22nd, 2023 will be charged a late fee of \$45 per horse.

FAXED OR EMAILED ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

Entries may be submitted at www.horshowsonline.com

MORGAN ENTRIES: Horses shown in this division must be registered with the American Morgan Horse Association, Inc., or an organization having registry reciprocity, (Canadian Morgan Horse Association, British Morgan Horse Society, Swedish Morgan Horse Society.) Horses must be entered under their full registered name or if under one year of age be eligible for registration. Horses must be entered under the names of the owner(s) or lessee of record. A copy of the registration papers showing recorded ownership or proof of lease must be submitted with entry form at the time of making entry. Competition management is responsible for notifying exhibitors of this requirement.

FRIESIAN ENTRIES: Individuals signing the USEF Entry Agreement (rider, driver, handler, agent of an owner, or trainer) for horses competing in the Friesian division must be members of the International Friesian Show Horse Association or pay a non-member fee to IFSHA for each competition. All Friesian horses competing in Friesian classes must have an IFSHA number, not just Friesian registration papers. All Friesian classes will accept only purebred Friesians, regardless of registry. All horses must be sound and in good condition. Each horse shall be shown in its natural splendor with a full mane, tail and feathering. Braiding is optional.

US EQUESTRIAN MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT:

Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above, Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage Competitions, Endurance Rides and Vaulting Competitions: (See GR828.4 of the Federation rules). Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler,

rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR231) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes

SAFE SPORT: Reminder: All USEF life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U. S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF SafeSport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org.

SHOW PASS FEE: The USEF Show Pass must be applied for via an online application through the USEF website by the exhibitor or owner. Only one show pass per season per exhibitor or owner is allowed before the individual needs to become a USEF member. Coaches and trainers are no longer eligible for a show pass and must be an Active USEF member. All exhibitors in Amateur classes must have a USEF amateur membership. For more information, go to <https://www.usef.org/faqs/usef-show-pass>.

NON-SHOWING HORSE FEE: There is a \$55.00 charge per horse for those stabled on the grounds but not entered or shown in any classes. This fee is in addition to stall fees.

USEF DRUG FEE: Every horse participating shall pay a \$23.00 Federation fee (\$15.00 shall be the equine drug and medications fee).

ENTRY FEES: All Qualifying classes are \$40.00; all Championship classes are \$55.00.

AWARDS: A prize and eight ribbons will be awarded in all classes unless otherwise noted.

CHAMPIONSHIP ELIGIBILITY: Exhibitors must enter and show in their respective section for each Championship. Cross entering is allowed between the Classic Pleasure and the English

Pleasure Divisions and the Classic Pleasure Driving and Pleasure Driving Division if shoeing requirements are met.

LIMIT RIDER CLASSES: All entries in limit rider classes will be eligible to show back in either their respective limit rider or age group championships.

LADIES CLASSES: All entries in ladies' classes will be eligible to show back in their respective amateur championship if they were qualified by an amateur.

SCRATCHES: An exhibitor failing to scratch an entry at least one hour prior to the session in which the class is scheduled will be assessed a \$25.00 scratch fee. All scratches must be made using the official scratch form and signed by the secretary. Money for qualifying classes is not refunded but may be put toward another class. Management reserves the right to cancel, combine, or split any class. Class changes will be posted in the Secretary's office.

SPLIT CLASSES: Classes may be split at the discretion of the horse show management. Splits will be posted outside the horse show office. Both sections will be pinned. Championship classes which are split will have a call back to pin one champion.

ADDING CLASSES: Please note the Management will not consider adding classes to the schedule without a minimum guarantee of three entries to show in the class and a sponsorship which must be paid prior to the added class.

REFUNDS: Refunds requested prior to the closing date of entries, May 10th, 2023, will be processed in full. Entry fees will be refunded due to an injury/casualty to a horse or exhibitor, or an immediate member of the exhibitor's family only when the exhibitor provides the show secretary with a veterinarian or doctor's certificate no later than the start of the show. Stall fees and office fees will not be refunded for any reason after the close of entries on May 10th, 2023.

ACADEMY ENTRIES: Riders in this division are students who are currently taking lessons and are to be judged on their basic riding skills. The age of the rider must be listed on the entry blank. Headers for leadline riders must be at least 18 years of age. Horses must be lesson horses (please see horse eligibility section below). Horses are not to be judged. Class splits will be made at the manager's discretion. There will be no more than two splits for each class. Classes will be divided between seats if entries warrant. If it becomes necessary to split classes into A and B sections due to shared horses, Section A of both classes will be run consecutively, then Section B, to reduce tack and rider changes. There will be minimum holds allowed. Please

be prepared to enter the ring when the class is called. An Academy rider may not enter any other division at the show. A rider who has shown in a regular division or in a full riding suit at any show is prohibited from participating in the Academy Division.

ACADEMY HORSE ELIGIBILITY: All horses/ponies used in Academy classes must be used regularly in lesson programs. All breeds are welcome. Horses used in Academy classes can cross enter into the regular horse show classes with different riders.

ACADEMY RIDER ATTIRE: Helmets approved for horseback riding (no bicycle helmets) are mandatory for all exhibitors. Riders must wear appropriate boots.

Saddle Seat: Kentucky jodhpurs, boots, shirt, and vest. No full saddle suits allowed.

Hunt Seat: Breeches, boots, and hunt shirt. No coats allowed.

Western Seat: Western jeans or slim fitting pants, long sleeve shirt with a tie.

Pelham bridles or full bridles may be used (martingales allowed). There are no shoeing restrictions or requirements. Protective boots are allowed. Braiding is optional.

YOUTH CONTEST ELIGIBILITY: The winner of the senior division AND all senior contestants to score over 800 points qualify to compete in the youth contest at the Grand National and World Championship Morgan Horse Show. A contestant who has qualified to compete at the Nationals MUST complete their Sherman badge BEFORE the time of the National contest. Senior contestants can only win ONE youth of the year contest per year. The same contestant can compete in all four divisions of another contest but CANNOT place overall. If only one contestant is entered in the contest, they MUST score over 700 points to qualify for the Grand National Youth of the Year Contest. Contestants must complete all four parts of the contest, Horsemanship, Judging; Written Test, and the Oral Presentation, in order to qualify for an overall award.

STABLING: There will be 620 permanent stalls with doors available. Show management cannot guarantee the same stall location from year to year. There will be no additional stabling. Due to the stabling limitations, early entries are advised. No initial bedding provided.

HORSE STALL FEE: \$145.00

SHAVINGS: TBD

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS: Massachusetts Department of Public Health requires that no equine over 6 months of age is permitted at any horse show in the Commonwealth unless it is accompanied by a negative Coggins Test which was conducted within the previous 6 months for out-of-state horses, or 12 months for in-state horses. Foals under 6 months of age shall be exempt from the requirements provided that the foal is with its dam and the dam is accompanied by an official negative Coggins test. Further, it is required that all horses must have a certificate to prove the Eastern and Western Equine Encephalitis, Equine Influenza Virus, and Equine Herpes virus (rhinopneumonitis) vaccines have all been administered within six months (Refer to USEF GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule for more information). Per Eastern States Exposition requirements, all horses must have a health certificate dated within 30 days regardless of state of origin.

HORSE ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE: The grounds will be open to all exhibitors and horses from 8:00 A.M. on Monday, June 5th, 2023 until Sunday, June 11th, 2023.

CAMPER ARRIVALS: Campers or horse trailers with living quarters will be parked in the area designated by the management. Camper stickers will be issued at the gate by the Eastern States and must be displayed at all times. The fee to be paid at the show office is \$295.00 for campers requiring 30 amp service, or \$380.00 for campers requiring 50-amp service. A daily fee must be paid to Eastern States Exposition for each day a camper is on the grounds prior to Monday, June 5th, 2023.

BOX SEAT FEE: Box seats will be available during the entire course of the show at the rate of \$125.00 per six seats.

RETURNED CHECK FEE: There will be a \$50.00 charge for all returned checks and/or declined credit cards.

BILLING FEE: A \$25.00 fee will be charged to any exhibitor or farm who must be billed after the show.

FOOTING: The coliseum show arena is 100' x 200' and is sand footing. The warm-up footing is sand or grass.

LUNGING: Horses are not permitted to be lunged in the coliseum.

QUIET TIME: There will be "quiet time" in the Coliseum the first hour after the conclusion of the afternoon session. We ask that exhibitors and trainers respect this time.

GOLF CARTS: Golf carts must be ordered directly through the show manager. Please see the order form at the back of the prize list.

DOGS: Dogs are welcome to attend the 2023 Connecticut Morgan Open Horse Show. DOGS MUST REMAIN ON A LEASH AT ALL TIMES. Unleashed dogs pose a danger to the safety of our exhibitors, spectators, and other dogs. Anyone with an unleashed dog may be subject to a fine from the Eastern States Exposition.

FIRE AND SAFETY REGULATIONS: The following regulations must be adhered to in accordance with the Town of West Springfield Fire Regulations and Public Safety Code:

1. No smoking allowed in the barns or the Coliseum.
2. No open flames allowed in any building.
3. All fabrics used as backdrops and/or display must be flame retardant.
4. Burlap material is not allowed for display.
5. Bark mulch is not allowed for display material.
6. Large wood chips or coarse bark mulch may be used in barns, but shall be kept damp at all times.
7. No motorized gasoline/diesel vehicles.
8. All exits and fire lanes shall remain free and clear at all times.
9. No excessive accumulation of litter or rubbish.
10. All aisles shall be a minimum 10" in length.
11. Aisle displays widths are not to exceed 2 feet.
12. Main aisles 30" from each side.
13. Side aisles 24" from each side.
14. All children 12 years of age and under must wear a helmet when riding a bicycle.
15. No rollerblading or skateboarding.
16. No glass bottles or containers.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for

penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

COVID-19 ACTION PLAN: The Connecticut Morgan Horse Association, Inc. and the Connecticut Morgan Open Horse Show are committed to keeping our exhibitors, spectators, trainers, staff, and industry members safe. We will continue to comply with local, state, and national regulations regarding Covid-19. We will comply with all USEF Covid-19 recommendations. CMHA and CMOHS reserve the right to update, amend, cancel, or move classes and horse show events. For more information about Covid-19, please visit USEF's COVID-19 Tool Kit or the CDC.

DIRECTIONS TO THE EASTERN STATES EXPOSITION:

FROM CONNECTICUT AND POINTS SOUTH:

Take I-91 North from Rte. 2, I-84, I-95, or the Merritt Parkway — Follow I-91 North to Mass. Exit 3 to Route 5 North to Rte. 147 West, Memorial Avenue approximately 3/4 mi. to ESE's Gate 9 parking lot.

FROM BRADLEY INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT:

Take Rte. 75 North to Rte. 147 East. Continue approximately 1/2 mile to ESE's Gate 9 parking lot.

FROM VERMONT AND POINTS NORTH:

Take I-91 South to Mass. Exit 13B, to Rte. 5 South, to Rte. 147 West. Continue approximately 3/4mi. to ESE's Gate 9 public parking lot.

FROM BOSTON AND POINTS EAST:

Massachusetts Turnpike West to Exit 4, to Rte. 5 South to Rte. 147 West. Continue approximately 3/4 mi. to ESE's Gate 9 parking lot.

FROM THE BERKSHIRES AND POINTS WEST:

Take the Massachusetts Turnpike East to Exit 4, to Rte. 5 South, to Rte. 147 West. Continue approximately 3/4 mi. to ESE's Gate 9 parking lot.

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION:

Amtrak and CTRail offer direct rail service to Springfield's Union Station and with connecting bus service and MetroNorth service in New Haven Connecticut.

CARRIAGE DIVISION

- Appropriate carriage driving customs, rules and traditions are to be followed. The Carriage Driving Division will be held in accordance with the most current USEF rules. It is the competitor's responsibility to be familiar with the current rules.
- **Entry:** Entry is defined by horse and driver combination.
- **Driver:** Drivers may compete more than once on same course with a different horse. Grooms and passengers may compete as a driver in the same course. Junior drivers under the age of 14 must be accompanied by a knowledgeable adult driver capable of rendering assistance. All junior drivers must wear a properly fitted ASTM/SEI approved headgear with the chinstrap fastened always.
- **Vehicle:** Different vehicles may be used in different classes. It is the driver's responsibility to present the correct vehicle for measuring prior to any obstacle classes.
- **Horse:** Horses may compete more than once on the same obstacle course, but not in the same class (except as part of a multiple).
- **High Point Awards** will be tallied and posted, as the show progresses, at the Carriage board.
- **Driven Dressage:** Tests can be found at USEF.org **NOTE:** be sure to look for the Carriage **Pleasure Driving** Dressage Tests.
- **Order of Go:** Will be posted on the official carriage notice board, located in the carriage field. Dressage and Reinsmanship will have specified drive times. Management will do its best to accommodate conflicts with classes in the main ring. It is the competitor's responsibility to notify the carriage coordinator as soon as conflicts are identified. It is the competitor's responsibility to be ready to go when called. After a reasonable wait, management may announce that a time limit may be invoked. Some classes may be run back to back.

DIVISIONS

LIMIT: Open to any sized equine or driver not having won six (6) first place ribbons, which must include at least one first place ribbon from each of three (3) approved USEF carriage pleasure driving or ADS pleasure driving competitions.

OPEN HORSE: Open to any Horse entry. Open to all junior, adult, and multiple drivers.

OPEN PONY: Open to any Pony entry. Open to all junior, adult, and multiple drivers.

OPEN SMALL PONY: Open to any Small Pony entry that is 47 inches and under. Open to all junior, adult, and multiple drivers.

CHAMPIONSHIPS POINTS awarded as follows: 1st place – 8pts; 2nd place – 7 pts; 3rd place– 6pts; 4th place – 5pts; 5th place – 4pts; 6th place – 3 pts; 7th place – 2 pts; 8th place – 1 pt.

HIGH POINT CHAMPIONSHIPS ARE AWARDED TO THE ENTRY THAT ACCRUES THE MOST POINTS FOR THE QUALIFYING CLASSES LISTED.

HIGH POINT OPEN HORSE CHAMPIONSHIP: awarded to the entry accruing the most points in the open horse classes: Working, Individual Reinsmanship Test, Timed Obstacles and both placings in Dressage. Ties will be decided by Reinsmanship placing.

HIGH POINT OPEN PONY CHAMPIONSHIP: awarded to the entry accruing the most points in the open pony classes: Working, Individual Reinsmanship Test, Timed Obstacles and both placings in Dressage. Ties will be decided by Reinsmanship placing.

HIGH POINT OPEN SMALL PONY CHAMPIONSHIP: awarded to the entry accruing the most points in the open small pony classes: Working, Individual Reinsmanship Test, Timed Obstacles and both placings in Dressage. Ties will be decided by Reinsmanship placing.

HIGH POINT LIMIT CHAMPIONSHIP: awarded to the entry accruing the most points in the limit classes: Working, Individual Reinsmanship Test, Timed Obstacles and both placings in Dressage. Ties will be decided by Reinsmanship placing.

HIGH POINT OPEN HORSE OBSTACLES CHAMPIONSHIP: awarded to the entry accruing the most points in the open horse classes: Pick Your Route, Fault & Out, Timed Obstacles and Precision Exhibition Obstacles. Ties will be decided by Timed Obstacles placing.

HIGH POINT OPEN PONY OBSTACLES CHAMPIONSHIP: awarded to the entry accruing the most points in the open pony classes: Pick Your Route, Fault & Out, Timed Obstacles and Precision Exhibition Obstacles. Ties will be decided by Timed Obstacles placing.

HIGH POINT OPEN SMALL PONY OBSTACLES CHAMPIONSHIP: awarded to the entry accruing the most points in the open small pony classes: Pick Your Route, Fault & Out, Timed Obstacles and Precision Exhibition Obstacles. Ties will be decided by Timed Obstacles placing.

HIGH POINT LIMIT OBSTACLES CHAMPIONSHIP: awarded to the entry accruing the most points in the limit classes: Pick Your Route, Fault & Out, Timed Obstacles and Precision Exhibition Obstacles. Ties will be decided by Timed Obstacles placing.

******NOTE: Double Jeopardy & Carriage Dog will not count towards high point obstacle championship.**

Precision Exhibition Obstacles

- a. To be driven over a prescribed course of numbered obstacles. The number of obstacles to be proportionate to the dimensions of the driving area. Not to exceed 20 obstacles.
- b. As this class should be considered a test of precision driving.
- c. After passing through the Start line, the driver proceeds through each obstacle in order and through the Finish line.
- d. Placings will be determined on a low-fault basis (i.e., those with fewer faults finish ahead of those with more faults). Time will decide ties for those with equal fault totals.

Individual Reinsmanship Test: Competitors enter the ring individually and drive a short course of defined elements in order and at prescribed paces from memory. Entries must follow the designated track without deviation. Unless otherwise specified, elements begin when the horse's nose reaches the marker. To be judged on the driver's skill: use of aids, control of the horse(s), accuracy, quality of transitions and gaits, with additional consideration of impressions of the turnout and driver. Position and Aids – The driver should be seated comfortably on the box so as to be relaxed and effective. Either the one- or two-handed method of driving is acceptable. Common to both methods, contact with the horse's mouth should be maintained with an elastic, supportive hand. Drivers should not be penalized or rewarded for using one style over another. The use of the whip and the voice are important aids in driving and should be used effectively and discreetly.

Scoring: The entry receives numerical scores between 0-10 for each element – on use of aids, control of the horse(s), accuracy, quality of transitions and gaits. Half-points may be used for scoring all elements. (Maximum total score = 10 x number of elements)

Overall Impression – of the turnout on the condition and fit of the harness and vehicle, neatness of attire. (Maximum total score = 10)

General Impression – of the driver on posture, relaxation, confidence and effectiveness.
(Maximum total score = 10)

Perfect Score = 10 x total number of elements + 10 for General Impression + 10 for Overall Impression. Ties are decided by the total of Overall Impression and General Impression scores.

The scale of marks:

- 10 – Excellent
- 9 – Very Good
- 8 – Good
- 7 – Fairly Good
- 6 – Satisfactory
- 5 – Marginal
- 4 – Insufficient
- 3 – Fairly Bad
- 2 – Bad
- 1 – Very Bad
- 0 – Not Executed

**** “Not executed” means that nothing of the required movement has been performed.
The judge may state the reason on the score sheet for each mark.

CARRIAGE DRIVING DIVISION

Open to any entry competing in the Carriage Driving class at the show. To be held in the Coliseum, Thursday evening session.

143. **People's Choice Carriage Pleasure Driving Championship**

Open to any entries that competed in any Carriage Driving class at the show. To be held in the Coliseum, Friday evening session.

OPEN SMALL PONY 47 INCHES AND UNDER

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and _____ ("USEF Event" or "USEF Events"); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the "Agreement"):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, with-out limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").
