<u>CITY STAFF</u>: City Manager Ted Soltis, Fleet Manager John Gerwitz, Golf Course Superintendent Steve Rutherford, Director of Administration Pat Nichols and Deputy City Clerk Lisa Hunt.

<u>PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE/INVOCATION:</u> The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Councilmember Kester. The Invocation was given by Gloria Montoya from Day Star.

NEW BUSINESS:

- a. Public Hearing Fiscal Year 2020- 2021 Final Budget. Mayor Young opened the Public Hearing at 6:02 p.m. A call to the audience for comments was made. After hearing no comments, the Public Hearing closed at 6:03 p.m.
- b. Resolution 20-12 A Resolution adopting Fiscal Year 2020-2021 Final Budget. Mayor Young read Resolution 20-12 by heading.

c. Ordinance $20-01 - 2^{nd}$ reading: An Ordinance levying a primary property tax upon the assessed valuation of property located within the City subject to taxation for the Fiscal Year ending June 30, 2021. Mayor Young read Ordinance 20-01 by heading.

Clarifying comments were made by Councilmembers.

ROLL CALL VOTE: Councilmember Dixon "Aye", Councilmember Jackson "Aye", Councilmember Kester "Aye", Councilmember Marsh "Aye", Councilmember Nilsson "Aye", Vice Mayor Payne "Aye" and Mayor Young "Aye".

- d. Public Hearing: Sanitation Rate and Transfer Station Fee increases. Mayor Young opened the Public Hearing at 6:09 p.m. Pat Nichols, Director of Administration, spoke of his observations seeing the daily revenues and expenses. A call to the audience for comments was made. After hearing no further comments, the Public Hearing closed at 6:13 p.m.
- e. Resolution 20-13: A Resolution increasing Sanitation Rates. Mayor Young read Resolution 20-13 in its entirety.

f. Resolution 20-14: A Resolution increasing Transfer Station Fees. Mayor Young read Resolution 20-14 in its entirety.

Councilmember Dixon asked City Manager Soltis if the rates are posted on the City of Holbrook Website. City Manager Soltis responded "Yes".

g. Golf Cart purchase approval – Steve Rutherford, Golf Course Superintendent, requested that the Council approve the purchase of 12 used Yamaha Golf Carts from Desert Golf Cars for a total amount of \$47,737.20. Councilmember Dixon ask Mr. Rutherford several questions about the Golf Carts. Steve answered all his questions.

h. Parks Department mower purchase approval – Steve Rutherford spoke on behalf of Napo Baldonado in Parks requesting approval to purchase a Z Master Zero-Turn Rider – 7000 Diesel Series, 25 HP Kubota Diesel 72" Turbo Force Deck from Simpson Norton Corporation for the total cost of \$15,692.08.

i. Street Department back-hoe purchase approval – John Gerwitz requested the approval of the purchase of a 2020 Caterpillar 416 from Empire CAT in the amount of \$103,496.44. Mr. Gerwitz explained that of the five back hoes that the City of Holbrook owns, two are incapacitated, two are mid 90's models and one is a 2012 model. He explained keeping some of them running is more than they are worth.

CALL TO THE PUBLIC FOR NON-AGENDA ITEMS:

Michael Sample from the Navajo County Fair Board. Mr. Sample shared that the Annual Navajo County Fair has been cancelled because of health and safety reasons. He also shared that the Fair Board will still be hosting youth events at which they will implement CDC Guidelines. He encouraged everyone to show up and support the youth events.

SUMMARY OF CURRENT EVENTS-MAYOR:

Mayor Young said that he would like to offer his condolences to the family of Hardy Sulu, who passed away. He also wanted to commend the citizens of Holbrook for helping to bring the COVID 19 rates down. He encouraged everyone to continue what they are doing for the next few months.

SUMMARY OF CURRENT EVENTS-COUNCILMEMBERS:

- *Councilmember Jackson offered his condolences to the family of Bunky Maestas.
- *Councilmember Marsh is working from home and appreciates being in town during the work week to see all of the happenings. He thanked all of the City employees and Ted Soltis for all they do.
- *Councilmember Dixon echoed Councilmember Marsh commending the City employees and Ted Soltis.
- *Councilmember Nilsson did a shout out to the schools. He said that Dr. Koerperich and every member of the staff are doing an incredible job of getting kids involved.

- *Councilmember Kester thanked City Employees including office staff for all their hard work. He also said that the old transfer site behind the American Legion is looking good.
- *Vice Mayor Payne stated that City Staff are working hard through the COVID 19 pandemic. Staff have had to continue to respond to water breaks, Police calls, animal complaints, etc. She also stated that she has a complaint about how the City of Holbrook looks. She said that realizes that it has been hotter this year, but it is also because the citizens are not doing their part. Vice Mayor Payne stated that the transfer site behind the American Legion is clean as a whistle. Every Department helped with this project and came to together to help each other out. She wanted to encourage friends, neighbors, and herself to help clean up Holbrook.

SUMMARY OF CURRENT EVENTS-CITY MANAGER:

- *Mr. Soltis shared that the City has two openings on the Planning and Zoning Commission. If anyone is interested, please send a letter of interest to City Hall.
- *The new park signs have been installed at Gillespie Park, Heward Park, Hunt Park, Lewis Park, and Lisitzky. Thank you to Northland Pioneer College students for making the signs and to City crews for installing them.
- *Thank you to Boy Scout Troop 7156 for painting the Police/Fire Department. The City of Holbrook certainly appreciates your help.
- *Additional work needs to be completed at the Police Department. Staff will be repairing leaks and cracks, removing brush from around the building, and the gutters will be replaced. It was determined that the roof does not need to be replaced.
- *Staff will be starting on the roof replacement at the golf course shop. The roof has leaked for several years. There will be a design modification to eliminate future leaks.
- *The clean-up of the property between the cemetery and the hospital is complete. City crews did a great job. The remaining tractor trailer will soon be auctioned.
- *The new truck turn-around at the golf course is complete.
- *The pool and splash pad will close on August 22nd. At that time, our crews will begin work on repairing the water leak under the splash pad.
- *Julie Harrison, who has worked in the Wastewater Department for 14+ years, has moved out of the area and resigned from her position. We thank her for her years of work for the City and wish her the best.

- 7. Monthly Inventory Figures beginning and ending figures for food and liquor
- 8. Chart of accounts (copy)
- 9. Financial Statements-Income Statements-Balance Sheets
- 10. General Ledger
 - A. Sales Journals/Monthly Sales Schedules
 - 1) Daily sales Reports (to include the name of each waitress/waiter, bartender, etc. with sales for that day)
 - 2) Daily Cash Register Tapes Journal Tapes and Z-tapes
 - 3) Dated Guest Checks
 - 4) Coupons/Specials/Discounts
 - 5) Any other evidence to support income from food and liquor sales
 - B. Cash Receipts/Disbursement Journals
 - 1) Daily Bank Deposit Slips
 - 2) Bank Statements and canceled checks
- 11. Tax Records
 - A. Transaction Privilege Sales, Use and Severance Tax Return (copies)
 - B. Income Tax Return city, state and federal (copies)
 - C. Any supporting books, records, schedules or documents used in preparation of tax returns
- 12. Payroll Records
 - A. Copies of all reports required by the State and Federal Government
 - B. Employee Log (A.R.S. §4-119)
 - C. Employee time cards (actual document used to sign in and out each work day)
 - D. Payroll records for all employees showing hours worked each week and hourly wages

- 13. Off-site Catering Records (must be complete and separate from restaurant records)
 - A. All documents which support the income derived from the sale of food off the license premises.
 - B. All documents which support purchases made for food to be sold off the licensed premises.

The sophistication of record keeping varies from establishment to establishment. Regardless of each licensee's accounting methods, the amount of gross revenue derived from the sale of food and liquor must be substantially documented.

REVOCATION OF YOUR LIQUOR LICENSE MAY OCCUR IF YOU FAIL TO COMPLY WITH A.R.S. §4-210(A)7 AND A.R.S. §4-205.02(G).

A.R.S. §4-210(A)7

The licensee fails to keep for two years and make available to the department upon reasonable request all invoices, records, bills or other papers and documents relating to the purchase, sale and delivery of spirituous liquors and, in the case of a restaurant or hotel-motel licensee, all invoices, records, bills or other papers and documents relating to the purchase, sale and delivery of food.

A.R.S. §4-205.02(G)

For the purpose of this section:

1. "Restaurant" means an establishment which derives at least forty percent (40%) of its gross revenue from the sale of food 2. "Gross revenue" means the revenue derived from all sales of food and spirituous liquor on the licensed premises, regardless of whether the sales of spirituous liquor are made under a restaurant license issued pursuant to this section or under any other license that has been issued for the premises pursuant to this article.
