CALL TO ORDER: Mayor Young called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

*Councilmember Marsh let the public know that there is a vacant Council seat. He encouraged interested persons to get their letter of interest in.

SUMMARY OF CURRENT EVENTS-CITY MANAGER:

*Mr. Soltis stated that crews are in the process of removing all of the tires from the reuse pond and replacing with rip-rap. For some reason, years ago, the process of installing rip-rap stopped and tires were used. Unfortunately, the tires did not work very well: they floated into piles.

*Mr. Soltis thanked the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints missionaries. They provided assistance removing some of the tires from the reuse pond. The City is fortunate to have a number of groups like this who provide volunteer assistance.

*Mr. Soltis thanked Barbara DeSpain. She keeps the East and West end rest stop tourist posters in good shape. She also makes sure that the old cemetery is kept clean and free of weeds. Barbara prefers her work not to be mentioned. Nevertheless, is important for the community to know about some of the great work our volunteers do. *Mr. Soltis has written some additional grants and will be looking for different opportunities. One for picnic tables and a shelter structure at East End Dog Park and one for City Hall and Police Department computer servers. *The Water Department has replaced all of the water meters at Sun Valley with remote read meters. This will significantly cut down on meter reading time. Meters will be automatically read as staff perform inspection rounds. *Finally, as a reminder, there is a vacant seat on City Council. Letters-of-Interest should be sent or dropped off at City Hall by 5:00 p.m. on February 18, 2021. Interviews well be conducted by the City Council on February 25th. We have a great City Council and look forward to the addition of a new team member.


