Not Acceptable -Tanglers:

Please do not place the following items in the recycle bin as they will tangle up the very expensive machinery used to sort and process the recyclables: Anything stringy such as ribbon, cords, cables, hoses, tarps, chains, tubing and wires.



Not Acceptable - Hazardous Materials:

Please do not dispose of anything in the recycle bin that held any hazardous liquids, gases (propane & helium); no hazardous powders or batteries and definitely no medical waste such as needles & IV bags.



Supporting the Environment through Recycling

Not Acceptable:

No LED TVs, computers, phones, electronics, etc. No glass windows, No building materials, No doors & mirrors, No dishes (baking or eating) and absolutely nothing that is dirty as it contaminates the recyclables. We are not accepting plastic grocery bags – please recycle them at your local grocery store.

Cedar Creek Township Recycling Guidelines

Cardboard:

Flatten boxes, remove plastic and foam. Packing boxes, cereal, frozen pizza boxes, cake, shoe boxes, etc. Tape and labels are OK. No fresh pizza boxes due to food contamination.



Plastic Bottles, Jugs & Tubs:

(Must be clean) Rigid plastic only #1-7. No foam or polystyrene. Detergent & shampoo bottles, yogurt cups, milk jugs, etc. Labels are OK. Rinse & keep caps on.



Coated Cartons:

Any paperboard that held liquid such as milk, soy, & almond milk, juice boxes, creamer, broth – Rinse -- keep caps on.



Paper, Magazines & Paperboard:

Paper bags, newspapers, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, envelopes, phone books. Shred only what is necessary – put in clear plastic bag.



Glass Bottles &

Jars: (Must be clean) Clear & Colored food or beverage glass. Remove lids if metal – labels are OK.



Metal Cans & Foil:

(Must be clean) Labels are OK. Aerosol can MUST be EMPTY. Clean Tin Foil. Tin Pie Plates. Please place all metals in a separate bag. (No charge for metal products – Pandos Bin)
