2020: Member of the FIBA Olympic Qualifying Tournament team that went 3-0 and secured Canada's third consecutive Olympic appearance. Gaucher played in all 3 games, averaging 16.2 minutes a game, contributing a total of 7 rebounds and 8 points during the tournament.
