NATIONAL TEAM HIGHLIGHTS:

2020: Member of the FIBA Olympic Qualifying Tournament team that went 3-0 and secured Canada's third consecutive Olympic appearance. Raincock-Ekunwe averaged 6 points, 5 rebounds and 2 assists during the OQT in Belgium.

2019: As a member of the Senior Women's National Team, Nayo started all 6 games played in the FIBA AmeriCup where their team claimed second place. She averaged 23.2 minutes, 8.7 points, and 5.0 rebounds per game. Nayo started all 3 games in the FIBA Olympic Prequalifying Tournament where she averaged 14.7 points, 6.3 rebounds, and 3 assists per game. She was named the Bryan Anderson MVP at this tournament.

2018: Nayo played two games at the EGIC and contributed 13.0 points per game, 5.5 rebounds per game and 2.0 assists per game. In the USA Exhibition, Nayo played in two games averaging 19 minutes per game, 18 points, and 9 rebounds. She played three games when playing in the France Exhibition averaging 21 minutes per game...Nayo contributed a total of 22 points and 12 rebounds. During the World Cup, Nayo played an average of 25.8 minutes and averaged 8 points per game where Team Canada finished in 7th place.

2016: Member of the Rio 2016 Olympic Team, who placed 7th in the tournament; was the top rebounder in the game against USA, averaged 7.7 points per game, 6 rebounds and 22.5 minutes. Played 2 exhibition games in Spain averaged 17.7 minutes, 4.0 points and 5.0 rebounds. Played 3 exhibition games in France averaging 23.8 minutes, 8.7 points, and 5.0 rebounds. Played 3 games in the Edmonton Grads exhibition tournament, averaged 9.6 points per game and 20.8 minutes. Played 3 games in the USA Showcase tournament, averaging 5.0 points per game and 20.7 minutes.

2015: Member of the 2015 Pan American Games team that won Canada's first ever gold medal averaging 10.5 minutes and 4.6 points a game. Played in three exhibition games in France and Spain. Helped the SWNT achieve gold at the FIBA Americas, qualifying for Rio 2016 Olympics.

2013: Played in all 4 exhibition tournaments and 2 exhibition games in Czech leading up to FIBA Americas 2013. First year playing with the Senior National team averaging 0.7 points, 7.19 minutes and 1.73 rebounds per game.

2012: Played in all 5 exhibition games with the Development Women's National Team, averaging 13 minutes and 4 points per game.

2011: Was a member of the 2011 Development Women's National Team that participated in the 2011 Summer Universiade where she averaged 16.1 minutes per game in the five games that the team played.

PROFESSIONAL HIGHLIGHTS:

2019-20: In her first season with Nadezhda, Nayo appeared in 31 games, averaged 30.1 minutes, securing 10.7 points, 2.3 assists and 8.2 rebounds per game. Awarded Player of the Week among Canadians playing abroad six times and Interperformances Player of the Week once in round 7. Named to the Eurobasket.com All-Russian PBL First Team as F/O, Forward of the Year and the All Imports Team.

2019: The second-year forward played 28 games for New York Liberty where she averaged 13.1 minutes per game, 3.7 points per game, and 2.8 rebounds per game

2018-19: Nayo played 27 games with Bourges and 16 Eurocup games in the 2018-19 season. She averaged 25.6 minutes, 11.1 points, and 5.7 rebounds per game.

2017-18: Nayo played 33 games with Nantes and finished with a 2-4 record over the course of 6 Eurocup games in the 2017-18 season. She averaged 32.4 minutes, 16.3 points, and 10.9 rebounds per game.

2017: Made her WNBA debut for the New York Liberty...Appeared in 33 games and averaged 9.2 minutes, 1.7 rebounds and 3.7 points per game

2017: After completing her season in Australia, Nayo finished the season in France with the Flammes where she played 5 games and a total of 108 minutes. She averaged 11 points per game, and played an average of 21.6 minutes per game. In this short time she averaged 5.8 rebounds per game.

2016-17: Nayo started her season in Australia with Bendigo, playing 24 games and tallying 686 minute played. While with Bendigo she averaged 28.1 minutes per game and 15.8 points per game.

2015-16: Played in 29 games for Wasserbrug... Averaged 25.9 minutes, 14.1 points, 7.3 rebounds and 1.0 assist per game. Assisting the Wasserburg team to finish 1st overall in the DBBL.
