NATIONAL TEAM HIGHLIGHTS:

2023: At the FIBA Women's AmeriCup, Alexander helped the team capture a bronze medal, averaging a double-double with 11.0 points and 12.3 rebounds per game. Alexander averaged 10 points and 10 rebounds per game as Canada went undefeated at the FIBA Women's Pre-Olympic Qualifying Tournament.

2022: Member of the Canadian team that placed 4th at the FIBA World Cup. Alexander lead the team in rebounding at 9.6 per game, while also adding 7.1 points and 1.1 blocks per game.

2021: Started all 6 games of FIBA AmeriCup, averaging 9.0 points, 7.0 rebounds and 1.3 assists. Member of Team Canada at 2021 Tokyo Olympics. Alexander averaged 3.3 points and 1.3 rebounds.

2020: Member of the FIBA Olympic Qualifying Tournament team that went 3-0 and secured Canada's third consecutive Olympic appearance. Alexander averaged 6.7 points, 3.7 rebounds, and 1.33 assists during the OQT in Belgium.

2019: Played in all 5 games of the Senior Team Phase 1. Alexander averaged 26.3 minutes, 13 points, and 8.7 rebounds in the Belgium Tournament, and 12.5 points and 7.5 rebounds in the Great Britain Exhibition. Alexander started 5 games in the FIBA AmeriCup where she averaged 22.8 minutes, 15.6 points, and led the tournament with 10.2 rebounds per game. The team finished with a silver medal and Alexander was named in the AmeriCup All-Star 5.

2018: Named to the 2018 FIBA World Cup roster but sustained an injury during the USA exhibition series that prevented her from playing in Spain.

2012: Played in all 5 games as a member of the Development Team... averaged 14.9 minutes, 6.6 points and 4.2 rebounds per game.

2009: Represented Canada at the U19 World Championships in Thailand. Averaged 11.3 points and 11.3 rebounds in 25 minutes per game

2008: Member of the Junior Women's National Team

PROFESSIONAL HIGHLIGHTS:

2021: Alexander played 19 games for Castors Braine in Belgium, averaging 15.0 points and 8.9 rebounds.

2020: Alexander played 16 games for the Minnesota Lynx in the WNBA in United States, averaging 2.8 rebounds per game and 4.0 points per game.
