President's Message

Welcome to the November edition of the PAAC Journal.

This is our first newsletter since the summer and the fall has been an incredibly busy season with various events and activities. First we had Greg Lyle giving us his insightful take on the new Ontario liberal government and why voters returned them to Queen's Park. We then had an engaging Award of Distinction luncheon with Dr. Ann Cavoukian, Ontario's former Privacy Commissioner. Our signature event Women in Public Affairs had a great session with Jennifer Keesmaat, City of Toronto Chief Planner; and a few weeks ago we hosted our traditional post-election panel to debrief PAAC members with campaign leaders of the leading five Mayoralty candidates.

In addition, PAAC has been active on the advocacy front. For example, we recently communicated to the Toronto Star our concerns over the negative characterization of lobbyists involved in the provincial policy process. We argued that lobbyists add value to all levels of the policy and legislative development process and the rules governing disclosure of lobbying activities is sound.

Also of note in terms of advocacy, we are working with the Gov-

ernment Relations Institute of Canada on a final submission to the federal Lobbyists' Code of Conduct consultation, including a series of meetings in Ottawa, Toronto, Calgary and Vancouver with Lobbyist Commissioner Karen Shepard.



The **British Columbia Chapter of PAAC** is now up and running. It recently held its inaugural meeting and elected an executive. Dr. Ann Cavoukian Recipient of PAAC Award of Distinction

Dr. Ann Cavoukian was the honoured guest at a luncheon hosted by the Public Affairs Association of Canada at The Loft at Arcadian Court on September 25. As PAAC's newest Award of Distinction in Public Affairs recipient Dr. Cavoukian joins a "who's who" of public affairs innovators and leaders recognized by PAAC.

Since 2001 PAAC has presented an Award of Distinction to a member of the public affairs community who, over their career, has made a significant contribution to public affairs in Canada.

Dr. Cavoukian is the former Information and Privacy Commissioner for Ontario and is currently Executive Director of the Privacy and Big Data Institute at Ryerson University.

Dr. Cavoukian is best known for her creation of Privacy by Design – unanimously adopted as an international framework for

privacy and data protection in 2010; now translated into 37 languages.
