

NOTES TO TESTATOR/TESTATRIX

1. You should keep a copy of your Will with your private papers.
2. You should tell your Executor(s) where your original Will can be found.
3. If you marry after the date of your Will you should consult with your lawyer. Marriage will, in most cases, automatically revoke your Will.
4. If any of the events listed below occur, you may wish to consult your lawyer as changes to your will might be desirable:
 - (a) If you change your name, or anyone mentioned in your Will changes their name.
 - (b) If the person(s) you named as your Executor(s) or Guardian(s) die or become unsuitable to act due to age, ill health, etc.
 - (c) If a beneficiary dies.
 - (a) If you subsequently sell or change the nature of any property you have specifically bequeathed.
 - (b) If you become divorced/remarried.
 - (c) If you adopt a child(ren).
5. If you wish at any time to REVOKE or ALTER your Will, you should consult your lawyer so that the legal formalities can be observed otherwise your wishes may not take effect.
6. You may also wish to contact your lawyer if your estate increases significantly.
