Try Out an Orange Food

Have you heard the phrase "eat the rainbow"? This advice ensures that you're meeting various health needs, since the color of a fruit or vegetable is often linked to specific nutrients. This month, reach for orange foods to match the season's changing leaves and rake in a bounty of benefits.

Vibrant orange produce gets its hue from carotenoids, which act as powerful antioxidants and provide protection at the cellular level. Many

carotenoids are transformed into vitamin A when ingested, supporting healthy vision and a strong immune system. Three daily servings of orange fruits and vegetables can also improve the appearance of your skin.

Orange foods are commonly high in potassium and vitamin C, helping the body fight infection, improve cardiovascular health and maintain healthy nerves and muscles. An orange-filled diet also aids the reproductive system, which regulates hormones and is important for your brain—affecting mood and cognition.

The obvious fruit, an orange, is a solid choice, but other smart selections include mangoes, apricots, papayas or kumquats. Vibrant vegetables include sweet potatoes, carrots, pumpkins and butternut squash.



Sydney Opera House: A Golden Milestone

Australia's top tourist destination, the Sydney Opera House, is celebrating 50 years! Officially opened on Oct. 20, 1973, by Queen Elizabeth II, this UNESCO World Heritage Site welcomes nearly 11 million visitors annually.

This symbol of modern Australia takes up the entirety of Bennelong Point, an island in the Sydney Harbour. The roof of the Opera House is one of its famous features. Resembling ship sails, it consists of 2,194 precast concrete "shells" that weigh up to 15 tons each. Anchored with concrete piers that go 82 feet below sea level, the entire construction is as tall as a 22-story building.

The famous performing arts structure was designed by architect Jørn Utzon. The project took 14 years to complete (a decade longer than expected!) and went wildly over the budget of \$7 million, with a final cost of \$102 million.

The first performance occurred in 1960, before the building was finished. American vocalist Paul Robeson climbed the scaffolding and sang "Ol' Man River" for the construction workers on their lunch break. Since then, iconic performers have included Ella Fitzgerald, Joan Sutherland, Bob Dylan, The Cure and Prince. The Opera House has also hosted memorable figures such as Nelson Mandela, Arnold Schwarzenegger and Pope John Paul II.

Don't Miss This Solar Eclipse!

This month brings an exciting sky event to those of us in the Western Hemisphere. On Oct. 14, a narrow path from the Oregon Coast to the Texas Gulf Coast will experience an annular solar eclipse, and the rest of the continental U.S. will be able to view a partial solar eclipse.

An annular solar eclipse occurs every one to two years, when the moon passes between the sun and Earth. The moon will appear smaller than the sun because it is farther away from Earth than during a total solar eclipse.

Because of this, a "ring of fire" will appear behind the moon, as the sun won't be completely blocked out. The partial solar eclipse, however, will reveal the sun as a crescent shape when the moon crosses in front of it because the viewing angle doesn't provide a perfect lineup of the Earth, moon and sun.

Be sure to use protective eyewear when viewing this spectacle. Normal sunglasses aren't appropriate; instead, you'll need special solar eclipse glasses or solar filters if viewing through a telescope, binoculars or camera.

It can be fun to view the eclipse indirectly, too. Create a pinhole projector by simply punching a hole in a piece of paper. Then stand with your back to the sun, hold up the paper and let it project the sun's image onto a wall or clear spot of ground. You can also watch the eclipse online.
