Cameron never understood how drugs could take a hold of life, until some friends from his high school football team introduced him to Methamphetamines. He learned how easy it was to spiral out of control when you are unable to let go of the thing that is controlling you.

Growing up in Kalamazoo wasn't always easy for Cameron. He grew up in a broken home where his parents divorced. Amidst an unhealthy relationship with his Father and a Mother who struggled with addiction, Cameron had to grow up fast. The one thing that kept him holding on was the support of his Grandparents and taking care of his siblings.

Through a series of bad choices and unforeseen turns, Cameron became homeless, and he felt himself hitting "rock bottom". He knew that if he didn't make some changes, his life was in jeopardy. With a motivation to turn his life around, Cameron started looking for a job. He knew it wouldn't be easy, but with determination, Cameron was able to get a job as a dishwasher at a local restaurant.

Everything was lined up for his first day of work except for a pair of work boots. Working in a kitchen requires the right footwear. With no money, he wasn't sure where he was going to get a new pair of shoes. But he remembered a place that his grandfather used to volunteer. A place that helped people like Cameron who just needed a little bit of support to get their life back on track. That place was KDC.

Moments after walking in the doors of KDC and meeting with staff, Cameron found himself in a car with a KDC staff member on their way to the store to buy him a new pair of shoes. KDC was also able to help Cameron when he moved into an apartment. They helped provide furniture and household items to help him get started in his new home. Cameron is hopeful for the future and placing his trust in God for the next steps.

"I used to take the building blocks of life and I would take them and throw them into a big pile and jump onto it and hope it held up. And every single time it would fall apart. Now I am taking each one of my blocks and strategically placing it so when I stand on that foundation it's going to hold up for the rest of my life"

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

Kalamazoo Gospel Ministries is more than a shelter from their storm, it's a place to heal from the trauma experienced through homelessness as a family. KGM, is committed to providing child and family centered services that promote trauma resolution in both children and parents.

KGM offers a Children's Ministry Program open to infants through fifteen years of age. In a supportive and nurturing environment, families are provided a safe haven and an opportunity to learn and grow on every level. "We are focused on providing a safe learning environment where children experience the love of Jesus," says Kami Galvin, Manager of the Children's Ministry. "The children we minister to often come in from chaotic and stressful situations. When they come into the center, we want them to experience a positive and loving atmosphere." says Kami.







SONSHINE KIDS

With several programs to offer, **Sonshine Kids**, welcomes infants through preschool offering age appropriate activities, snacks, and lots of positive care from staff and volunteers. Sonshine Kids is offered daily throughout the week, providing parents the flexibility to meet with their case manager and work towards their goals.

CREATION STATION

Knowing that school aged children need a safe and positive place to after school, **Creation Station** offers a wraparound program where kids can take their minds off the stresses of daily life and enjoy games, cooking lessons, outside activities and more. One highlight for school aged children is an evening bible study offered through a local ministry partner, Kindness Acts 20:35.

CASE MANAGEMENT

Basic needs are the first step to healing. With hot nutritious meals and a place to sleep out of the elements, men, women and children have time to decompress from the trauma of being homeless.

While basic needs are important, Kalamazoo Gospel Ministries offers more. We are committed to helping guests

assess their needs and identify the barriers. Through one on one support, Case Managers meet with individual guests, taking the time to truly listen and help identify their next steps. "We provide an atmosphere where people grow and identify a plan for their lives," says Sheldon McCullough, Director of Programming. "It's vital that each Case Manager truly listens and asks God's help in discerning the right steps to take towards independence."

Case Managers are supportive in multiple ways. They're often counselors, an advocate when meeting with area agencies, but most importantly, they share their own testimony of how Jesus has transformed their lives. Never a requirement for staying at the Mission but, always part of our support, KGM staff serves as the hands and feet of Jesus to all who seek our services.
