

We sat down with Women's Shelter Staff members and asked them to tell you what it's like to work on the front lines of the shelter. They all agree, it is highly rewarding. Walking alongside guests, supporting them in developing their God given purpose, helping them obtain employment and transitioning them into stable housing is a true victory for each staff member. Women's Shelter Staff have the unique and complex role as supporter, teacher, leader, coach and friend.

Meet Jackie and Tammy, Lead Supervisors at KGM. "We have an awesome team of ladies who genuinely care for the Women and Children. Seeing guests transition into independence is a team effort and each one of us has a role," says Jackie.

Kathy, a former guest, now staff member recalls how hard it was to walk into the mission for the first time. "I was so scared; I wasn't street smart and needed a place to stay," says Kathy. "Jackie was the first person I met that night and she is part of why I am now in my own apartment and have a full-time job. Her support got me through a very rough point in my life."

Currently, there are twelve incredible ladies who serve guests with the love of Jesus. They are grateful for those who pray and support the ministry role they have at KGM.
