Born and raised in Kalamazoo, John knew at an early age, that he liked to run. In high school, he joined the cross-country team, and his talent continued to grow. As an established member of the team, John regularly had the fastest times. This led to a scholarship for a local college and John was honored to be able to work towards a degree.

With an earned degree, John coached various teams over the years, and felt he was making a difference in the lives of young people, encouraging them to pursue their own talents.

But a dependence on alcohol took its toll. Binge drinking led to a series of seizures, and doctors advised him against drinking again or alcohol could take his life. He spent several months at a local rehabilitation hospital for healing. When his rehabilitation was complete, John had nowhere to go.

He was dropped off at Kalamazoo Gospel Ministries with no idea of what to expect. He certainly was aware of the landmark, always knowing we were here, but never knowing the kind of programming we offered.

John knew he had to make some changes in his life and sought out the help of Johnny, one of KGM's guest advocates. Because John had a plan and knew the direction he wanted to go, Johnny was able to assist John in getting his birth certificate, his state identification, and help John make an application for social security benefits.

John has faced challenges over the last year, but recognizes God is making a way for him. He sees how KGM has supported him over the last six weeks and is truly grateful. "Johnny and I instantly had a connection," says John. "We understand each other and that is why I am seeing progress in my life."

John has a positive outlook on life and knows his path will be different. He is hopeful for housing soon. Just like cross country running, John doesn't see what's around the next bend, but he sees a clear path, and he is committed to following it to a healthy, independent future.

SUPPORTING KGM with a DONOR-ADVISED FUND

HOW DOES A DONOR-ADVISED FUND WORK?



DONATIONS

A donor makes an irrevocable, tax-deductible donation to KGM



INVESTMENTS

The donor may advise the investment allocation of the donated assets. Any investment growth is tax free



GRANTS

The donor may recommend grants to qualified public charities of his or her choice







So, what exactly is a donor-advised fund?

A donor-advised fund, or DAF, is an account into which you deposit assets for donation to charity over time. You, the donor, get a tax deduction for making contributions to the donor-advised fund. A sponsoring organization manages the account; you recommend how to invest and where to donate the assets.

In addition to providing financial support to charities, donor-advised funds can provide more immediate income tax deductions for donors, as well as potentially reduce capital gains taxes and estate taxes. You do not have to be wealthy to get into a DAF; some have no minimum initial contributions.
