Generally, my letters have focused on the guests that we serve, the challenges they face, and the diversity of the life changing programs we offer at KGM. I also try to make it a habit to thank our many partners that make this ministry possible. They are vital to the success of KGM.

Today however, I'd like to talk about the men and women that make up the Kalamazoo Gospel Ministries team. On all of our campuses, KGM, KDC, Simple Treasures, Rescued Treasures and Rescued Wheels, the staff that care for our guests continually go above and beyond. They are committed to bringing the life changing message of the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the lost and hurting in our community at all costs.

Often-times, the personal ministry that members of our team provide goes completely unnoticed. No one sees the team members who, following their regular shift at KGM, will go to hospice and sit with a guest through the night, to provide companionship because KGM is the only family they have.

The next day, that same team member shows up for their regularly scheduled shift ready to give 110%. We don't often talk about the staff person who, on their own time, visits guests who have been hospitalized to read them a scripture and pray with them because their family may live in another state. That team member who prays passionately with the parent of a sick child, all while having a sick child at home themselves. There are the team members who sign up for special events, picnics, and other outings, just to make sure that the guests have a variety of fun things to do during the summer. And then there is the weekly zoom prayer time, every Monday, where staff meet and pray for our guests, volunteers, partners and community. These are some of the many ways our team cares for the guests outside of their normal work hours.

As a single mother of five boys, Toya's life seemed to be an uphill battle. While living in Detroit, it was hard to get the help she needed to take care of her family while she worked toward the living expenses they needed. "Before the mission, it was a constant struggle." Eventually, Toya had no other option but to move herself and her children to Kalamazoo Gospel Ministries.

For almost 7 years Toya fought to make things work out for her and her family. Staying in motels, at friend's houses, and other areas, but nothing seemed to work out.

Finally, in 2017, Toya thought she was heading in the right direction. She had housing for her family, and they were out of the mission. But through a set of unfortunate circumstances, she and her family had to move back into the mission in September of 2020. This was such a heartbreaking time for Toya, but she chose to think of her children first. Kalamazoo Gospel Ministries was the safest place for them to be.

Now almost a year later, Toya has seen immense blessings come out of her time in the Gospel Mission. Toya stands firm in believing that God has not forgotten about her and her family. "He has a purpose for all of us. We may not see it, but we have a purpose." Recently, Toya got a full-time job in the ministry's kitchen. She shows love for others in the food that she cooks. Even though Toya always thought that she would move back to Detroit, she feels called to make it work here in Kalamazoo. Soon, Toya and her youngest sons will be moving into transitional housing for the next year.

Toya hopes to own her own business one day. She is so grateful for all the resources offered to her at the Mission and is constantly praising God for all the ways that He has blessed her and her family. "I try to be obedient to Him and I keep praying to Him and giving Him all the honor glory and praise because He's been with us this whole time."

Gaining Identitification With the Help of KDC

Another very important aspect of what Kalamazoo Gospel Ministries has to offer is KDC. KDC is a ministry site located on the Northside of Kalamazoo, and is available to anyone in the community who's having a hard time making ends meet.

One very important resource is Identification Recovery. IDs are a convenience that many of us take for granted on a day-to-day basis.



It is hard to imagine not having your social security card or birth certificate whenever you need them, but sadly that is a reality for too many people. This is where KDC comes in. For those who are struggling to find a job, enroll in school, or pay for housing resources, one of the first steps is to maintain proper identification. This can be anything from a Michigan ID, driver's license, birth certificate, or even a social security card.

Without these, it is next to impossible to get out of a financial crisis. KDC has helped in recovering 553 IDs from 2019-2021, even during the pandemic. Of those 553 IDs, some are even international. Through KDC, one of our community members was able to obtain a recovered certificate all the way from Greece.

Thanks to your support and donations, KDC has been able to help all these people and will be able to continue to bless many more who are in need.

IDEA Center
