Well, Fall is upon us, and Winter isn't far behind. As the temperatures begin to fall, we tend to see an increase in the number of people looking for shelter. We function as a night-time shelter and work in tandem with area partners to provide services to anyone in need.

Ministry With Community does a great job of providing daytime shelter. They have both the staff and daytime services to support anyone who would choose to come to their facility.

At KGM, guests who are not in our long-term programs are allowed to come inside if they are willing to volunteer to help with daily chores that keep our facilities running smoothly. They have the option of helping in the kitchen, the warehouse, or any number of other places inside the mission that supports the services they receive, from the meals they will receive to the shelter that is provided at the end of the day.

The men and women who are in our long-term program have made the choice to work with our program staff to change their current situation. They have decided to seek long term solutions as provided through life skills and other classes.

In John 5, Jesus met a man at the Pool of Bethesda, He first asked him if he wanted to be made well, which should have been obvious but, Jesus wanted him to commit to what he wanted first. Then Jesus told him to do something he previously couldn't do, "Take up your bed and walk". The man's healing was in his obedience. He had to choose to do something different to receive something different. Everyday people make choices that will either change their situation or allow them to continue on their current path. We are here to walk alongside anyone that comes to KGM and support them in moving forward, no matter the path they choose.

I encourage you to give us a call and schedule a tour so that you too can see first-hand the facilities and programs we provide. We are always happy share our ministry up close and personal.



MEET ANGELA

After graduating high school, Angela was told to leave her home and become an adult on her own. That's when her depression set in. "After leaving my home, I felt confused about what I was supposed to do next," said Angela. It was during this time that her oldest daughter was born. Angela felt the best thing for her daughter would be to put her up for adoption. Instead, her family decided to raise her baby for her, but the pain of giving her up caused Angela to slip into a drug addiction that took over her life.

With her drug addiction calling the shots in her life, from time to time, Angela would find refuge in the safety and consistency of the Gospel Mission. "I used to come into the shelter at night so high on drugs that I would wake up in the morning and not know how I got there," said Angela. She was in and out of the mission for almost eight years before she began to see the light at the end of the tunnel.




About a year ago, Angela started seeing posters taped up around the mission advertising the relaunch of the long-term program, New Life | New Hope. For the first time, Angela felt she might have a way to break free from her addictions. Angela attended a meeting to learn more about the program and felt the Lord calling her to take the first step toward making a fresh start.

Soon after joining the program, Angela began to see the differences a healthy lifestyle can make. She began job training classes in the Career and Education Center, where she learned administrative and people skills. "The Career and Education Center has been an exciting place for me to grow, and I've enjoyed working with the staff and volunteers at the Career and Education Center," said Angela.

Last month, Angela celebrated one year sober from her past life of drug use. Having the stability that the New Life | New Hope program provided, Angela was able to apply for an apartment and has applied to work at the Career and Education Center so that she can continue to learn and train with the staff and volunteers there.

"I thought that God had turned His back on me, but here I am, free from my addictions and in my first apartment. Only God can transform lives like this."
