She appreciates the shelter and mentors she has found in the staff and their supportive words.

The environment at *KGM* has given Jessica the time to learn more about God and has given her hope for the future. "I know God has a plan and a purpose for my life," she says. As Jessica imagines what's next, she has set goals; Jessica wants to graduate from the New Life | New Hope Program and become a women's shelter staff so that she may someday, become a mentor to women going through the same experiences she has had in her life.




OUTREACH IN THE COMMUNITY

All revenue is used to support the ministry's life-changing programs and services for those experiencing homelessness right here in **Kalamazoo**.

These stores also provide a training ground where students of **KGM's New Life | New Hope long-term program** learn vital workplace skills as they perform retail functions.

Rescued Wheels accepts new/used vehicles and sells them to the public at a very reasonable price. "Often, the cars we are selling to the public are for families who are not in a position to purchase a car from a new car lot," says Michael Moore, Manager of Rescued Wheels. "These cars help struggling families who need to get their kids to school and access to the grocery store."

- 1. Write it down. We pick up messages through subtle or unspoken cues daily, but the clearest way to communicate one's thoughts is to put them in writing. Compose letters for your loved ones that share personal stories, lessons you've learned, your journey of faith, and loving words that explain how you feel about them. You could also draft an ethical will which adds a personal, heartfelt dimension to your legacy plan. Be clear about what you want them to know.
- 2. Collaborate missionally. Do you have funds earmarked for blessing Christian organizations? Invite your loved ones to share input on where you give, then donate together. Or perhaps you volunteer time toward a cause you're passionate about. Invite family into an afternoon of serving the Lord together. By demonstrating your closely held values in action, they'll have a road map to do the same.
- 3. Make yourself available. The most meaningful investment you can make in the life of your children or grandchildren is yourself. Be a reliable and trustworthy source. Be generous with your time, your presence, and your listening ear. Your love will speak volumes and set a powerful Christ-like example.
