Eviction. Ciera stared at the big red words on the paper, upset with God and unsure what to do. Suddenly, Ciera remembered the place she and her parents volunteered at when Ciera was little, Kalamazoo Gospel Ministries. Ciera grew up in Kalamazoo and graduated from Comstock High School in 2009. College followed after; she graduated with her CNA and degree as a medical assistant. Life was looking up for Ciera; she returned home and was excited for this next stage of life. Ciera became pregnant at 21, and as she was working for Goodwill, she found it hard to find a babysitter to take care of the baby. Her parents would help when they could, but more help was needed for her to keep her job. After losing her job, Ciera still had the dilemma of being unable to provide child care. She continued to be unemployed, which led to her eviction.

She remembered KGM in her time of need and went for shelter. At first, she was scared but put on a brave face for her kids. However, once she got to know the staff, she realized all that KGM has to offer. Ciera was beyond grateful for all the support, especially in the Children's Ministry. "The staff helped my kids learn how to walk," she said. Ciera was amazed by the lengths KGM went to in helping her get to a place where she could feel confident on her own, and she was beyond grateful for the staff's dedication to her wellbeing.






KGM desires to provide essentials for our guests, whether that's a bed, a hot meal, clothing, spiritual restoration, or educational opportunities. Being a night shelter, we saw the need for daytime programing that provides personal development. Our one-year residential program, New Life | New Hope, is an opportunity for our guests who desire to press reset and pursue a new path. Part of the NL|NH program is an education component. Our program members have weekly education classes and are individually trained depending on their educational level. Each student is assessed at the beginning of the program. Our Education and Career Manager evaluates their needs and helps them take steps toward the goal they desire to achieve.









The education program is comprised of three components: GED, college prep, and literary classes. Guests can choose how much help they need and which direction they want to go. At KGM, we value meeting people right where they are and helping them along the way, no matter their previous education. While in the program, one of our graduates was identified as having some previous college work under his belt. The education department was able to aid him so he could return to college after he graduated from the program. The education staff supplied assignments for him, similar to the college work he would see when returning. Not only did KGM aid him with class prep, but the staff also helped him apply for FAFSA and KVCC classes. After graduating from the NL NH program in the fall, he started classes full-time and completed all his courses that semester.

Creating a will ensures your financial house is in order, your final wishes are clear, and your family is saved stress and expense.


#### 3. SPREADS THE LOVE.
