[00:01:41] I had spent the last two months brushing up on my German and studying the Fuhrer's movements in 1939.

An event of that magnitude would affect everything... maybe my parents would never meet and I would never be born! Would killing Hitler kill me, too?

[00:03:26] It allows us to travel back through time, but to a parallel universe. I will kill Adolf Hitler here in this timeline and free this world from tyranny. But when I return home, everything will still be the same.

Language spotlight

Idiomatic Expression: "Put a bullet in his head"

- Meaning: This phrase is a violent idiom used to describe killing someone by shooting them in the head. It's quite graphic and should be used with care as it can be disturbing to some listeners.
- Synonyms: "Shoot someone dead", "Take someone out"
- Antonyms: "Spare someone's life", "Let someone live"
- Correct Use:
 - 1. "The assassin was paid to **put a bullet in his head**."
 - "The undercover agent was ordered to put a bullet in the head of the drug lord."
- Incorrect Use:
 - "He decided to put a bullet in his head of his problems." (Incorrect because the phrase is used to describe solving problems which is inappropriate and violent.)
 - "The task was difficult, so they decided to put a bullet in its head."
 (Incorrect because the phrase is used figuratively for a non-living entity which does not make sense.)

Idiomatic Expression: "Brushing up on"

 Meaning: To review or practice something in order to refresh one's memory or improve one's skills.

- Synonyms: "Revise", "Refresh", "Polish up"
- Antonyms: "Ignore", "Neglect"
- Correct Use:
 - "Before the final exam, he spent a lot of time brushing up on his maths skills."
 - 2. "She was **brushing up on** her Italian before her trip to Rome."
- Incorrect Use:
 - 1. "I'm **brushing up on** my dinner." (Incorrect because the phrase is used for an activity that doesn't involve learning or improving a skill.)
 - 2. "He was **brushing up on** sleep." (Incorrect because it's used for a natural process, not an ability or knowledge.)

Idiomatic Expression: "Wrap your head around"

- Meaning: To understand or comprehend something that is challenging or confusing.
- Synonyms: "Understand", "Comprehend", "Grasp"
- Antonyms: "Misunderstand", "Confuse"
- Correct Use:
 - 1. "It took me a while to wrap my head around the complex physics concept."
 - 2. "She had trouble wrapping her head around the new software."
- Incorrect Use:

- "I'm trying to wrap my head around my sandwich." (Incorrect because it's used for a physical object, not an idea or concept.)
- 2. "He's **wrapping his head around** the basketball game." (Incorrect because it's used for a physical event, not an abstract idea or concept.)

Idiomatic Expression: "Plant a seed of doubt"

- 1. Meaning: To cause someone to start questioning or feeling uncertain about something.
- 2. Synonyms: "Instill doubt", "Raise doubts"
- 3. Antonyms: "Reassure", "Affirm"
- 4. Correct Use:
 - a. "His comments started to plant a seed of doubt in her mind about the project."
 - b. "The competitor's impressive performance planted a seed of doubt in the athlete's mind."

5. Incorrect Use:

- a. "I will **plant a seed of doubt** in the garden." (Incorrect because it's used literally for planting, not for instilling doubt or uncertainty.)
- b. "He **planted a seed of doubt** on his mind." (Incorrect preposition use it should be 'in' not 'on'.)
