Torah Insights

Seventy four of the Torah's 613 commandments are in the Parshah of Ki Teitzei.

The following cannot marry a person of Jewish lineage: a mamzer (someone born from an adulterous or incestuous relationship), a male from Moav or Ammonite descent, a first or second generation Edomite or Egyptian.

Our Parshah also includes laws concerning the duty to pay a worker on time, and to allow anyone working for you—man or animal—to "eat on the job", the proper treatment of a debtor, the prohibition against charging interest on a loan and the laws of divorce.

Ki Teitzei concludes with the obligation to remember what Amalek did to you on your way out of Egypt.


