STATUTES MADE UNDER THE CHARTER

PROGRAMMES AND AWARDS STATUTE

Citation

1. This Statute is made under the authority vested in the Board of Governors by the Charter and may be cited as the Programmes and Awards Statute.

Interpretation

2. In this Statute, unless the contrary intention appears -

"field training" means an activity contributing to a programme of study or instruction undertaken by a student at a facility other than one provided by the University.

Power of the President to Issue and Enforce Rules

- 3. The President shall issue and enforce rules, not inconsistent with the Charter or a Statute, with respect to:
 - (a) the programme of study and instruction of the University;
 - (b) the degrees, diplomas and certificates or other academic distinctions that may be awarded by the University and the requirements for their award; and
 - (c) the formalities and ceremonies relating to the conferring of such degrees, diplomas and certificates by the University.

Obligation of the President to Report Rules

4. Rules made under this Statute shall be reported by the President to the first available meeting of the Executive Board and Board of Governors, respectively.

Application of Rules

- 5. Without prejudice to the provision of Section 3, rules made under that section may:
 - (a) prescribe the requirements for admission to a programme of study or instruction;

- (b) regulate the enrolment of students in programmes of study or instruction;
- (c) prescribe the requirements of students undertaking field training;
- (d) prescribe the conduct of written examinations or other forms of assessment;
- (e) regulate the admission, without examination, to a degree which the University has power to confer of any persons deemed eligible for such an award by the Board of Governors;
- (f) prescribe the requirements for the preparation and submission by a student of a written report or piece of independent research submitted in partial fulfilment of the requirements for an award of the University;
- (g) describe the colours and insignia of the University and the academic dress for officers and graduates of the University.

Operative Date

6. This Statute takes effect on 1 July 1991.
