



Number Sense and Quantity

In this activity you will count the number of apples placed on top of each animal's head.

What you will need

Ten Apples up on Top, by Dr. Seuss

10 red apples

lion, tiger, dog template

What you will do

1. Read the book *Ten Apples up on Top*, by Dr. Seuss
2. Then, reread the book and place the appropriate apple on the top of each animal's head as it occur in the book.
3. Count out the apples with your child.
4. Discuss with your child which animal has the most apples? Which animals have the least?

Learn More Together

Counting with your child occurs in every situation – at the grocery store, the park or at home (Ex. You have three teddy bears, let's count them). Look for items to name and count aloud with your child. As you practice counting with your child, touch their fingers as you say each number.
