Bear Valley skies viewed from the BVS Astronomy Club

Some have suggested that perhaps the Christmas Star was really a spectacular passing comet. Think of comets like floating icebergs made of leftover material from the formation of the solar system and preserved in the deep freeze of the outer solar system until perturbed and sent falling in towards the sun by a planet, passing star or collision with another small body. As it approaches the sun, it begins to thaw and produce its magnificent signature tail. The tail is primarily made of volatiles and dust flowing off the comet. While a passing comet can be a spectacular and awe-inspiring sight, its true legacy lies in that dust and debris it left behind. Over time, the tail material spreads out along the comet's

path. If the Earth's orbit crosses that of the cometary debris, some will inevitably hit, enter and burn up in our upper atmosphere. This is what we see as meteors or "shooting stars." Most of the meteors you see are remarkably small, something about the size of a grain of sand! They burn so brightly because they're moving incredibly fast.

Space is not empty, but filled with a surprising amount of stuff. Any night, you have a good chance of seeing a meteor or two. If, however, you are out when the Earth happens to be plowing through one of these cometary debris trails, many more meteors may be visible. These events are called "meteor showers" and are visible annually as the Earth returns to the

same spot in its orbit. There are many meteor showers through the year. This month has a particularly good one known as the Geminid Meteor Shower. The name comes from where in the sky the meteors appear to come from – the "radiant point." Thus, the Geminids ap-

pear to stream from a region in the constellation Gemini.

The Geminids last for about a week but peak around Dec. 14, when you might be able to catch between 50 and 100 meteors per hour. Simply go outside on a dark night, get comfortable and watch the sky!

Want to give the Bear Valley Fish a Christmas gift? Recycle your Christmas tree to the LQAC!

The LQAC would like to recycle your used Christmas trees into functional aquatic habitats within Four Island and Cub Lake. The goal is to collect between 200-300 Christmas trees, then recruit local community volunteers help to create and place the newly created habitats within the lake in January. Over the past three years of surveying the lakes, it has been found that there is little to no aquatic habitat/structures within the lakes. This makes it very difficult for small fish to survive and thrive within our lakes, as they spend most of their energy swimming, rather than on growing. The Christmas tree recycling program is a cost effective first step towards correcting this deficiency within our lakes.

For this program, please make sure all the lights, ornaments, and tinsel have been removed from the tree. Additionally, if your tree has been flocked, it will not be able to be used. You can drop off your tree at any time after Jan. 1, to the marked tree drop off location by the Jacks Hole parking lot. Once the goal of 300 trees has been reached, the drop off area will be taped off, and signs will be hung indicating no more trees will be accepted.

In January, after the trees have been collected, our hope is to make this a community event by working with local volunteers and youths for the creation and placement of the newly-created aquatic habitats.



These habitats provide the base building block for a food web to begin. First microorganisms, and small insects attach to the bark and thrive. Small fish are then attracted because of the small organisms upon which they feed. Small fish also utilize the space between the branch-

es and trunks for safety, and shelter. Larger fish are then attracted by the smaller fish which they prey upon. Within the Bear Valley lakes birds, and turtles are at the top of the food pyramid and will utilize these habitats as they feed upon the fish that reside around and

within them. Essentially think of these aquatic habitats as your refrigerator and if you're like most people (fish in this case), your most comfortable chair is relatively close to the fridge, not on the farthest end of the house.

To create these habitats, the trees will be weighted down with cinder blocks and placed within the lakes next to one another. The habitats will be placed so they lay horizontally on the bottom and are underwater at full pool level, creating

the new aquatic habitats. These aquatic habitats will be placed in key places around the lakes to initially improve spawning and young of the year survivability. A later second phase will focus on increasing angling opportunities. A future



This year, and the next, the Tailwaggers Dog Club wants to focus on helping our community's dog rescues. The top goal of rescues is to provide low-cost vaccinations and spay/neuter programs. Tailwaggers has taken on the task of helping them raise money in order to provide this service. To bring a SNIP bus (a low cost spay and neuter service) to Tehachapi it will cost approximately \$7,000 to spay or neuter 45-50 dogs.

When the number of puppies born are fewer, rescues can focus on helping those already in the shelters and at Humane Societies find good homes. In the Bakersfield Shelter, it was reported that as of August of this year, 15-20 dogs were put down a day. This year alone, 1,136

dogs have died at this Shelter and there are 1,118 left to be rescued or put down.

- Stay informed and be ready for impending emergency communication/action.
- Keep all roads clear and await official instructions.

RESIDENT RELOCATION or EVACUATION

- Residents advised to prepare to relocate or evacuate.
- 2. Prepare residence to evacuate including shutting off gas at house main.
- 3. Follow Action Plan*** to evacuate.
- Evacuate your residence when instructed with pre-prepared go bag, essential items, family members and pets.
- Urgent Evacuations via Bear Valley Road and main gate.

POST-DISASTER ACTIONS

- Ensure personal and family safety & well-being.
- Only return to residence when safe and advised by official sources.
- Be aware of safety issues including washed out roads, contaminated water, gas leaks, broken glass, downed power lines, etc.
- Inform local authorities of health and safety concerns.
- Document all damage via phones, videos, notes.
- Check on your neighbors.

Text of Adopted Changes to BVSA Rules

ARTICLE 15 GOLF COURSE AND DRIVING RANGE

(Adopted 7/9/88)

SECTION 1500. GOLF COURSE

- Use of the golf course is restricted to Members of the Association, their families, guests and assignees of Members. Guests must (a) be accompanied by a Member unless the Member obtains a Guest Pass for the guest. See Section 1504, Member Responsibilities. Golf Course hours of operation are dawn to one half hour after dusk. Members shall notify the Pro Shop of their rounds played outside of the Pro Shop hours of operation. (Amended 03/10/08, Amended 01/10/17)
 - (1) Requests for tournaments/non-members
 - Use of the golf course may be extended to outside non-profits if said non-profit is being sponsored by a recognized BVSA Club and the request is submitted to the Course Manager to ensure no conflict exists with the requested dates relative to Member use and/or course maintenance. Once reviewed by the Course Manager the request will be forwarded to the Golf Advisory Committee for review and forwarded to the BVSA Board for approval. An appropriate fee for the requesting non-profit shall be charged in accordance with the non-member fee schedule established by Management. (Amended 10/17/22)
- All Members, their families and guests must register in the Pro Shop prior to teeing off. (b) All players must start on #1 or #10 tee unless given special permission from the starter.
- Persons under 16 years of age must be under parental or adult supervision while on the course except those having an approved (c) JUNIOR CARD or those who may be approved at the time of play by the Golf Pro or Golf Staff. (Amended 03/10/15)_
- Each player must have his/her own bag and at least three clubs and a putter. (Amended 1/27/01) (d)
- (e) All players are required to repair their own divots in the tee areas and fairways and must repair ball marks on the green. Each player is also responsible for raking bunkers after
