

Privacy fencing/screening guidelines

The ECC welcomes our many new members to Bear Valley Springs! Within Bear Valley Springs, our amazing views and wide-open rural spaces is one of many aspects that makes BVS unique. As we have received more new residents as transplants from more suburban areas, the ECC is receiving frequent requests for privacy fences. Although more common around the smaller lots near the golf course, privacy fences are discouraged

in most parts of the valley. The ECC highly recommends talking to our local nurseries to discuss planting evergreen vegetation, such as shrubs, bushes, vines, and trees, over building obtrusive fences for screening.

Privacy fencing/solid screening may only be used when it is demonstrated to the ECC that no other type of fencing or evergreen vegetation will serve the intended purpose. On lots of one-half acre or more, this type of fencing may only be used in the immediate vicinity of the object or area to be screened. The

permissible maximum height of privacy fencing is five feet high, with the exception of when it is used to shield hot tubs/jacuzzis, and then the height can be a maximum of six feet high. Privacy fencing, without exception, may not encroach on, or encompass, the front yard of a property. Properties adjacent to the golf course may not use privacy fencing except in an area close to the house where a hot tub/ jacuzzi is located and only to enclose the immediate area of the hot tub/jacuzzi.

As of July 2022, when any previously approved screening/solid/privacy fencing or portions of the screening needs to be repaired or replaced, a new submittal and approval is required by the ECC to determine if this type of fencing is still necessary based on the purposes for which the fence

was originally approved.

Privacy fencing that is constructed without ECC approval may be referred to the Board of Directors for possible disciplinary action, and if the fencing is not approved by the ECC, may be required to be removed at the owner's expense.

Submittals for all types of fencing can be found on our website at bysa.org in the Document Library ECC Documents. Submittals received by a Friday will be reviewed by the ECC the following Wednesday, but must also be checked and approved by the Community Services District (CSD) to ensure that the fencing is not encroaching on any easements. Hazard reduction information FAQ

With the hazard reduction deadline just around the corner, it is an excellent time to refresh our memories about Kern County Fire Departments' hazard mitigation requirements.

What is expected of me as a property owner?

Property owners who fall within the required guidelines

are expected to maintain their property free of fire hazards and accumulated vegetation growth throughout the year. June 1 is the deadline for completion of this clearance before annual inspections. All structures on the property, regardless of construction type or use, must have a minimum of thirty (30) feet of clearance and one hundred (100) feet of fuel reduction, or to the property, line if closer. Any vegetation

within these zones should be green, ornamental trees, grass, and shrubs only, and should be spaced out and have sufficient ground clearance to discourage fire spread. For vacant properties with no structures, you are required to provide a minimum ten (10) foot fuel break along all property lines that lie within one hundred (100) feet of any structures on neighboring properties.

What if there are no structures on the property?

If you own vacant property with no structures, there is a possibility you won't need to do anything. If there are any structures on neighboring properties within one hundred (100) feet of any property line, you are required to provide a minimum of ten (10) feet of clearance along all property lines that are adjacent to those structures. This clearance includes full removal of all grass and shrubs within that ten (10) feet and limbing up all trees and large bushes to avoid ground contact. Six (6) feet is a general rule of thumb for limbing of the trees.

What if I am physically or financially unable to do the work?

While we understand that certain circumstances make it difficult for homeowners to complete the clearances, we cannot allow hazards to remain that put your property and the community at risk. The financial burden of clearing your

property is much less than having to replace it. If you cannot complete the required clearances due to physical ailments or financial constraints, there are programs available in certain areas to assist you. If you contact your local area Fire Safe Council, they should have the most current information on these programs.

Does Kern County complete the required abatement if I am fined?

While we would like to provide this service in the future, the Kern County Fire Department cannot conduct fire hazard abatement on cited properties. If you are fined, it is your responsibility to ensure the required corrections are made on the property and notify us when it is complete. If this is done within 15 days from the citation mailing date, your fine will be removed.

Hazard Clearance Checklist

- 30 ft. clearance of all non-ornamental combustibles and vegetation around all structures including wood piles.
- 100 ft. reduction of all non-ornamental combustibles and vegetation around all structures.
- Remove trees and limbs within 10 ft. of stovepipe and chimney outlets.
- Remove any dead limbs that overhang or are adjacent to structures.
- Clear the roof of all combustible vegetation, including

leaves and pine needles.

- Provide a 10 ft. clearance of all combustible materials around propane and other fuel tanks.
- Provide a minimum 10 ft. clearance around all property lines that encroach on the 100 ft. defensible space of adjacent structures.
- All non-ornamental trees should be limbed within six ft. of the ground and dead limbs removed. Dead trees should be removed.
- Provide reduction of excessive accumulations of fuel that can be deemed a fire hazard.



Bear Valley Dressage Club holds Cavaletti Clinic May 6 and 7

The BVS Dressage Club is excited to offer a Cavaletti Clinic at the BVS Equestrian Center on May 6 and 7 with BVS resident, dressage rider and trainer, Chemaine Hurtado.

Cavaletti are small, raised rails, which are used in both English and Western disciplines. The rails will be placed at varied heights and patterns. Working over cavaletti improves the horse's rhythm, cadence, balance, suppleness, and self-carriage. This gymnastic workout tests the horse's sense of self-movement and body position, helping them become more nimble and sure-footed. It flexes and energizes the muscles.

Riders also benefit from cavaletti work; it helps the rid-

er improve their core and gain strength in their back and legs.

Chemaine, who has bred, raised, and trained 8 horses to FEI PSG and I-1, and 3 to Gran Prix, the highest level recognized by The International Federation for Equestrian Sports (the international governing body of equestrian sports) is enthusiastic about the value of cavaletti. "Cavaletti is an excellent cross training workout for your horse. Every horse in any discipline can benefit from Cavaletti work. The action of lifting each step over the pole creates more elasticity and range of motion in the horse's body."

Chemaine says that during the clinic, "I will set the poles in different distances for any



level of experience, confidence, and fitness level. We will have groups of four or five riders, so it's fun cheer each other on throughout the lessons!" Chemaine will adjust the height and position of the rails as horses and riders progress through the lessons. Riders may ride in more than one lesson per day and may ride one or both days.




News from the BVS Horsemen's Association

Text of Proposed Changes to BVSA Rules

TEXT OF PROPOSED CHANGES

(Deletions are shown in strikethrough type and additions in boldface underlined type)

ARTICLE 24 BEAR VALLEY NATURE
PATH & CUB LAKE WALKING
PATH (Adopted 8/10/11)

SECTION 2400. GENERAL RULES (a) Hours of operation are established by BVSA Management and may be changed without prior notice. (b) Every person using the

Bear Valley Nature Path and Cub Lake Walking Path must possess a valid BVSA Use Privilege Card, or BVSA Guest Amenity Use Pass, or be accompanied by someone with an appropriate card or pass. Amenity Use Privilege Card or BVSA Guest Amenity Use Pass must be presented upon request by a BVS Ranger or BVS Management. (c) Parking must be at Beaubien Field or Cub Lake designated parking areas. (d) Users of Bear Valley Nature Path and Cub Lake Walking Path must remain on approved and posted path. (e) Motorized vehicles, including, but not limited to, private autos, trucks, and golfcarts, are prohibited on the Bear Valley Nature Path. The following motorized vehicles are prohibited on the Bear Valley Nature Path and Cub Lake Walking Path: Type 3 e-bikes, mopeds, gas-powered motor bikes, quads dune buggies, and other similar equipment and devices. (Ref: KC Ordinance 09-230 and BVCSD Code 6-3-6].

(f) Bicycles, including Type 1 and Type 2 commercially-made E-bikes, are permitted on the Bear Valley Nature Path and Cub Lake Walking Path. Upon request by a BVS Ranger or BVS Management, identification of the type and wattage of e-bike as indicated by the manufacturer label must be shown by cyclist. Maximum MPH for any of the above is 20 miles per hour and riders must abide by the conduct rules as outlined in Section 2401. (f) (g) Baby strollers, roller skates, children's toys and scooters (human powered or battery operated up to 24 volts), and mobility scooters and bicycles are permitted on the Bear Valley Nature Path and Cub Lake Walking Path and must abide by the conduct rules as outlined in Section 2401.

SECTION 2402. MANAGEMENT AND ENFORCEMENT OF BEAR VALLEY NATURE PATH RULES (a) Any person who violates these rules shall be subject to disciplinary procedures, as outlined in BVSA Rules, Article 17 and Article 3, Section 308. Members are responsible for their guests and may be disciplined for guests who violate these rules

Purpose and Effect of Proposed Changes:

It has been noted that there have previously been no specific rules

pertaining to the Cub Lake Walking Path. Due to the proximity of the Walking Path with the Nature Path, it makes sense to clarify that the rules are the same for both paths.

Rule changes will also address the updated technology of electric and battery powered vehicles. These changes will clarify and permit Type 1 and Type 2 Electric (E-bikes) on the Nature Path and Cub Lake Walking Path. Type 1 (pedal-assist) & Type 2 (operation without pedal) E-bikes perform and are used in a similar manner and speed as a human powered bicycle, with maximum speeds of 20 mph. The State of California makes no differentiation in safety concerns between Type 1 and Type 2 E-bikes compared with traditional bicycles. Additionally, members with disabilities are utilizing these types of bikes and mobility scooters to be able to enjoy outdoor recreation. This change would permit these and other updated technology created since these rules were initially adopted, while also outlining appropriate conduct for the safety of all who are using these amenities.

All leaks are not created equal

When customers report a water break and do not see immediate action, they may feel that they are ignored. Even when the water has been leaking for days, the CSD staff is

busy behind the scenes ranking leaks, working with other utilities to mark their lines, and scheduling repairs.

All water utilities schedule repairs on a priority basis. This process allows us to use our limited resources where they will have the most impact. Our water supervisor has over 17 years of experience with our specific water system. His years of experience factor into the decision model that he uses to ranks these leaks, including:

- The type of pipe material
- The type of line (main or service)
 - The break history of the line
 - The type of break

- Potential water loss
- Potential safety issues
- Impact the repair will have through service interruption and street closures
- The amount of pressure in the line

We understand that all leaks are important, and repairs are always made as quickly as possible. Depending on the location and type of leak, it can require anywhere from two employees to an "all hands" situation, involving coordination between multiple departments and the use of heavy equipment. Just like residents and contractors, we must call in Underground Service Alerts (USAs) and wait for other utilities to mark their lines each time before we dig.

IMMEDIATE EMERGENCY REPAIR – Mainline Breaks

This was a complete blowout of a water main, with several splits in the line. Potential water loss was huge. Potential safety issues were real, and the leak already impacted the residential water service.

PRIORITY REPAIR – Waterfall leaks

This is a "waterfall" leak. With these, the priority is always to get the water turned off. Repair priority is dependent on how the leak impacts residents. While these leaks look dramatic, they are often pinhole leaks like those pictured below.



MEDIUM PRIORITY REPAIR - Big weepers These are likely to be small

These are likely to be smaller leaks once uncovered, but the location or circumstances can create additional hazards. As long as there are no more extensive, threatening leaks, these are repaired right away.



LOW PRIORITY – Small Weepers

"Weepers" are often pinhole leaks in service lines. The amount of water lost is small, and the damage and safety risks are low. These are repaired as time permits, and crews are available.



LOWEST PRIORITY - Drips

These are usually very small underground drips, likely caused by a leaking angle stop or clamp.



How you can help:


1. Check to see if the leak has been marked with white paint. If so, it has already been reported and we are waiting for other utility services to mark their lines before we begin the repair

2. If it hasn't been marked, please **call it in**. During business hours, you can call the leak in to the regular BVCSD business line at 661-821-4428. After hours and on weekends, you can call our office line and follow the prompts to reach the on-call personnel.

The Bear Valley CSD staff are happy to be of assistance if you have any questions. We are here to serve our community, and we will work hard to maintain the quality of life that can only be found in our beautiful valley.

Comets are coming! (and always will)



Probably all of us have seen comets and recall media reports of these returning "for the first time in decades." Our earliest ancestors wondered at, recorded and even feared comets. So what are these things and why do they keep appearing?

We now know these are bodies of rock, dust and ices, orbiting the sun in highly elliptical, long-period orbits from the distant fringes of the solar system. Hence, many keep returning on a regular schedule. Most are believed to be from the Oort Cloud; icy remnants of the early formation of the solar system

that lie more than 2,000 times farther from the sun than we are. Never condensing into planets, Oort Cloud objects are left to wander beyond Neptune until something perturbs their orbit sending them hurling toward the inner solar system. Approaching the Sun heats these "dirty snowballs" causing the ice to convert to gas that blows off some of its dust and is carried away by the solar wind. The diffuse region around the "head" is the coma while the streaming "tail" can be millions of miles long and points away from the Sun. This loss of mass, and the influence of planets they pass, further alters their orbits. Thousands have been observed plunging into the sun and we recently



watched as one slammed into Jupiter. It is possible such impacts in the past delivered water, atmosphere and organic compounds to the inner solar system, but any such impact on Earth today would bring nothing good. We are currently tracking some 4,500 for study and telescopes maintain a vigilant watch for any imminent collision. Spacecraft have been sent to photograph and study comets; one recently shot an impactor into the surface and collected some of the ejected debris.

Predictions show the Oort Cloud may contain more than a trillion icy objects so we can always look forward to enjoying their surprise visits to our neighborhood.
