We had a very minimal showing for our October 28th. trash pickup. Only six people the day of and two more signed up to do an area later. Eight people out of a community of almost four thousand homesites.




Shooting Range


All members and guests who plan to use the Range will need to register on the Whiting Center's online portal, RecDesk - bybas.recdesk.com if they have not previously done so in 2023. The Whiting Center staff will verify membership status and guest sponsorship. Once approved, the member and/or guest will complete liability forms, a safety test, and initial agreement to the updated Standard Operating Procedures that have been approved for use of the range through RecDesk. The Range will be staffed based on a minimum of 5 and maximum of 10 members/guests at a time. The Range is only open and staffed with a minimum of 5 shooters reserved. The Range will be open based on information from the Fire Department. It will close or be unavailable on "red flag days" or when high winds and dry conditions are expected. This means that the range may seasonally close or be sporadic in the summer and/or fall.

WESTERN BLUEBIRD NEST BOX PROGRAM:

Karen Pestana will present Tehachapi Audubon's on-going, 24-year western bluebird nest box program including instructions on how to become a citizen science nest box monitor and set up a nest box in your yard.

Her talk will included a 10-minute nest-cam video that captures western bluebirds in the nest box from laying eggs to young birds fledging.





A TEHACHAPI CITIZEN SCIENTIST **PROJECT SINCE 2000**

Karen will give a presentation about western bluebirds and other local birds that use the nest boxes, and how to join her group of volunteers as a nest box monitor.

Since 2000 Karen has coordinated volunteers to maintain and monitor 60+ Tehachapi bluebird nest boxes and report the findings to Cornell University Lab of Ornithology's NestWatch program. She is a wildlife biologist formerly at Edwards Air Force Base, California Fish and Wildlife, and the National Park Service.

Building a Blue Bird boxes will take place on Saturday, January 13th at 10AM (weather permitting). Location is 24221 Willow Pass Drive. We have 10 sets of precut pieces ready to build the boxes. Lake measurements are taken every 2 weeks during April through September. E.coli and Cyanobacteria are tested as necessary based on water appearance and previous test results. BVSA provides these data for your convenience but please determine your own personal risks/conditions and the fact that this is an unsupervised area and natural water body. During the summer, this information can fluctuate rapidly based on water temperature and usage.


