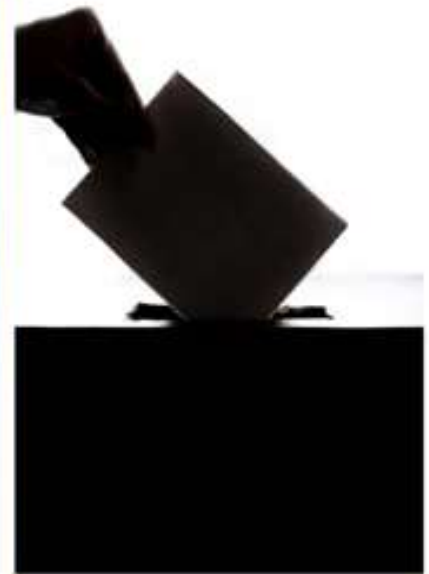

Help keep our Valley Clean, cover those trash cans on the way to the dump, don't put loose items in the bed of trucks and please don't Litter. You can also report uncovered Waste Management trash trucks to Waste Management and to the CSD (get the truck ID). This is a beautiful place to live, let's keep it that way.

We had a very minimal showing for our October 28th. trash pickup. Only six people the day of and two more signed up to do an area later. Eight people out of a community of almost four thousand homesites.

Even with only 6 people we managed to pick up 13 bags of trash and lots of large items as well. It is out there, you may not see it driving in your car, but it is there.

We would like to have more people get involved, younger people (we don't mean really young, we mean under 60). Most of our trash picker uppers range in age from mid-60's to 80.

I know it is hard to always come out on the day of trash pickup. If you are interested in doing an area one time or on an ongoing basis when it is convenient to you, please let us know and we will sign you up. We would also love to see some of our Bear Valley Clubs consider adopting an area to keep clean on an ongoing basis.

Shooting Range

All members and guests who plan to use the Range will need to register on the Whiting Center's online portal, RecDesk - bvsa.recdesk.com if they have not previously done so in 2023. The Whiting Center staff will verify membership status and guest sponsorship. Once approved, the member and/or guest will complete liability forms, a safety test, and initial agreement to the updated Standard Operating Procedures that have been approved for use of the range through RecDesk. The Range will be staffed based on a minimum of 5 and maximum of 10

members/guests at a time. The Range is only open and staffed with a minimum of 5 shooters reserved. The Range will be open based on information from the Fire Department. It will close or be unavailable on "red flag days" or when high winds and dry conditions are expected.

This means that the range may seasonally close or be sporadic in the summer and/or fall.

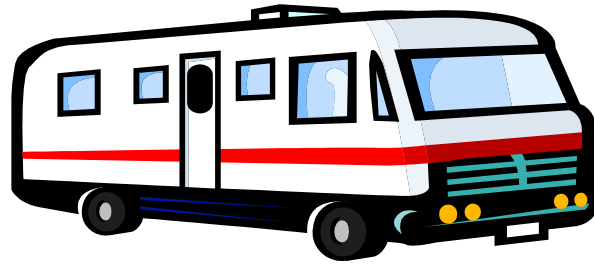

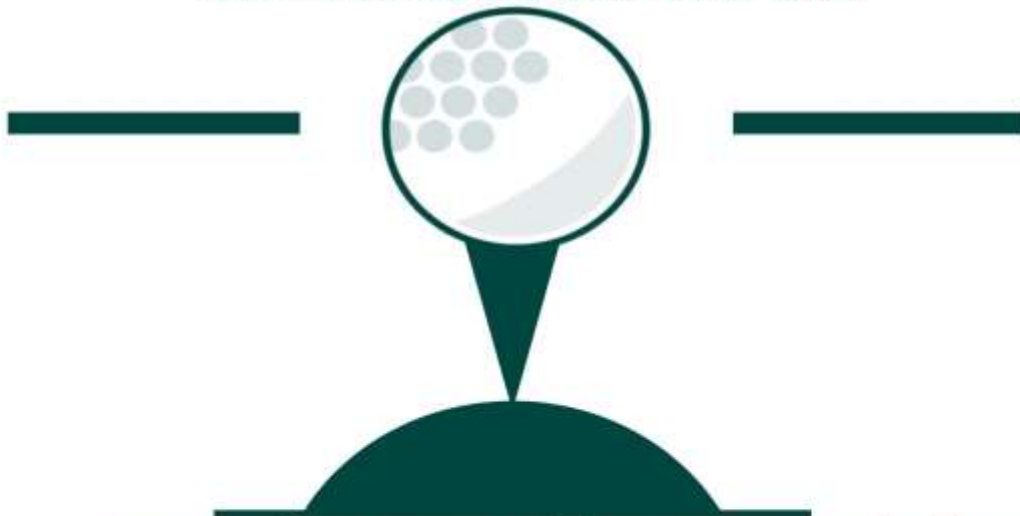
