n 2016, Day Nursery of Abilene worked hard to accomplish a rebranding goal set by the board of directors. The Day Nursery of Abilene logo received a refreshing update shortly after the end of 2016 and although we may have a new look, the essence of Day Nursery remains the same and our provision of child care services for children, working families, and the community is a constant! Our mission is still directed to meeting the community's need for affordable high quality child care services for ALL children (birth through age 10 years) while parents work attend school and/or job training programs.



Letter from the CEO Cynthia Pearson



ay Nursery of Abilene has always been committed to assuring a quality program as outlined in the mission statement, to provide affordable quality child care for a diverse community. During 2016 all of Day Nursery's centers were recertified as the highest quality child care program outlined in the State's Quality Rating and Improvement System (QRIS) referred to as the Texas Rising Star or TRS program. After receiving an in-depth assessment which spans over a period of at least several days up to a week or more, child care programs are given a rating of 2, 3, or 4 stars with a 4-star rating being the highest. Day Nursery is pleased to be a part of those few providers who have made a commitment to quality. In our region and state less than 16% of program participants chose to voluntarily participate as a TRS provider. Meeting these qualifications is a commitment to quality. It requires continued training opportunities for staff to promote their professional development, use of a research-based early childhood curriculum, plans and activities which promote each child's growth and learning as well as healthy, nutritious meals and snacks for children and finally opportunities for parent involvement and education. Additionally programs are then recertified on a periodic basis to assure that quality programming continues.

Day Nursery's investment in every child is supported by a caring community and each and every donor who believes in what we do now and how it benefits the future. Dr. Pam Schiller, one of the authors of the Frog Street early childhood curriculum used by Day Nursery of Abilene says "What you teach me birth to 3 is what matters most to me; what you teach me 3 to 5 is what helps me to survive."

Thank you for continuing to support the Day Nursery of Abilene and our children's program. Your investment in each and every child enrolled in one of our centers helps us teach them what matters and makes a difference in their future.
