Letter from the CEO Cynthia Pearson



The 2021 year for the Day Nursery of Abilene was one we'd hope would promise an end to the COVID-19 pandemic, however that unfortunately proved not to be the case. Although we were more than grateful to have the restrictions lifted placed on child care providers, the cases rose again toward the late summer, but some relief began with vaccine clinics being offered everywhere including those that Day Nursery offered in each of its four-child care centers. Increased handwashing and sanitizing continued regardless as just a plain old, best practice!

Updates to the Texas Rising Star (TRS) criteria for high-quality child-care providers in Texas were implemented. TRS is the State's quality and improvement rating system with rankings of 2-, 3- and 4-star providers with requirements well above minimum standards for child care. Each of Day Nursery's child care centers were assessed to meet these new requirements and meet the highest level as 4-star TRS centers to assure the quality of the programming in our community. We were pleased for the outcome of the 87th session of the Texas Legislature for the support given to the child care industry through the passage of several important bills. We were thrilled for the momentum that child care continues to receive attention in the State of Texas to invest in, strengthen and sustain this critical industry and delivery of quality program for Texas children! Day Nursery of Abilene received an 'Honorable Mention' via the publication of Texas' child care advocates, "Voices in the Field." The magazine featured the pandemic's impact on the Texas child care industry and how providers are working diligently to assure the continuance of child care in the state of Texas. It was fun to have our own Representative Stan Lambert dress the part as a Circus Ring Master and read "Come to the Circus to one of our PreK classes.

The 2021 "snow-mageddon" storm that hit Abilene impacted our operation as well for a week in February. Without electricity and water, were unable to run our operation for several days. Not since 2001 had Day Nursery had to close any of its centers due to weather.

Day Nursery was highlighted in March by the Child and Adult Food Program in Texas and featured St. Patrick's Day celebration for CACFP week in March. Program participation assures the nutritional needs of every child are met during every meal, each day! With 50% of a child's development based on good nutrition, this is critically important.

Dueling Pianos #3 was held during a chilly evening in April (who would have thought!) in partial outside quarters at Sockdolager. One of our very special families was highlighted during the event and our board performed on stage too.

The 5th annual "Abilene Gives" local giving campaign was held on May 4th. Day Nursery chose to use a Star War's themed day which was so much fun and our kids (and board too!) really got into it. We are grateful for this community support!


