BUFFY'S CROSSROAD

Buffy makes an incredible impact as a pastor, foster parent, and case manager. She is committed to helping others because of the new life God gave her.

All her childhood, Buffy felt something was missing. Buffy's grandparents received custody of her when she was six months old because her mother was unable to care for her due an unsafe living situation. While Buffy knew she was loved by her grandparents and her mother, they had a strained relationship.

The stress from the complicated situation with her family along with bullying at school caused Buffy to start acting out at age 13. **"I wanted to be**

seen, because I never felt like I was enough or understood," Buffy says. "I started hanging out with the kids that were getting in trouble. **The attention I got felt good."**

Escalating incidents with alcohol, drugs, and encounters with police were Buffy's ways of crying out for help. She spent several months in intensive mental healthcare facilities before coming to the Kentucky United Methodist Children's Homes (KyUMH) at age 14.

Buffy remembers KyUMH staff going out of their way to help her feel at home. In therapy, Buffy addressed the

motivations behind her behaviors. "My therapist said, 'There are different paths you could take. **If you continue down this path, where do you think it's going to lead you?"**'"

Buffy's eyes were opened to a brighter future for herself, and she started to live into it. She found reconciliation through family therapy with her grandparents. They worked together, learning to understand Buffy's needs.

"We all had to agree that we had to change how we treated one another and do better," Buffy said. **"I'm thankful to**

KyUMH for not only caring for me, but supporting my whole family."

When Buffy left our care, she was determined to start on a new path. She still wrestled with guilt over the things she had done in her past, and she was afraid God would not accept her. But one night, listening to a powerful worship song at her great-grandfather's church, she fully gave her life to God. With God's leading and help, Buffy was able to experience the love she longed for, a changed heart, and the strength to walk a new path.

As an adult, Buffy looks back at her time at KyUMH as a crossroads. **"God used KyUMH as a stepping stone to the life he had in store for me,"** she says. "It was an opportunity to get back on the right track and learn to better cope with stressors at home and school."

Today, Buffy is a 2009 graduate of Trevecca Nazarene University. She ministers to people in many ways as an ordained minister and co-pastor with her husband in the Free Methodist

Buffy says, **"I look back on what I experienced as a teen and see how God brought people and KyUMH to lead me down a path of hope and healing.** I'm forever grateful for what

Church, as a foster parent, and as a case manager for people with intellectual or developmental disabilities. Buffy has mentored several at-risk of youth through church and other community agencies sharing her story of God's grace, love, and hope. Her life verse is Philippians 1:6.

I've overcome and become today. I pray that sharing my story empower others in similar situations not lose hope, to trust God, seek and accept help and support, and rise above the obstacles they face for a better life. You are never too far gone."

March 20, 1921 - February 13, 2021 (age 99)

Donna Jean Harvey Cook, widow of Col. Richard H. Cook, passed away Saturday, February 13, in Lexington, KY. Born March 20, 1921, in Simon West Virginia, she was the daughter of the late T. H. and Bertha Hill Harvey.

Mrs. Cook was a graduate from Concord College in Athens, West Virginia earning her Bachelor's Degree and devoted her life to teaching. She was a faithful member of Nicholasville United Methodist Church in Nicholasville, KY.

Richard Countzler

December 31, 1928 - February 17, 2022 (age 93)

Richard Powell "Dick" Countzler, of Greenville passed away on February 17, 2022. Born in Louisville, he graduated from Greenville High School in 1947 and Howard College (now Samford University) in 1952 with a Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy. Dick and his wife Martha were married in 1950.

Dr. Todd was born in Ashland, KY. He graduated from Ashland Senior High School in 1939, and served in the US Military shortly thereafter. Mrs. Joanna Todd was born in Bremen, KY and graduated from Bremen High School in 1948.

Dr. Todd attended Illinois College of Optometry and graduated in 1948. He came to Central City in 1948, where he practiced optometry until retiring in 1982. Mrs. Todd attended Baptist Nursing School in Louisville and graduated as a Registered Nurse in 1952. She worked at Greenville Hospital (now Owensboro Health Hospital) and later at Muhlenberg County Health Department.

Dr. and Mrs. Todd were dedicated members of Central City First United Methodist Church. They both served on church boards and led Sunday School classes. Dr. Todd was active in the Volunteers in Mission program of the UMC, supplying thousands of used eyeglasses to people in need across the world.
