

GRANTS AWARDED

REPORT TO WEST BLETCHLEY COUNCIL - CHILDREN'S SERVICES

The children's service enables Keech to provide care and support to children with life-limiting conditions, and their loved ones, through an in-patient unit, community nursing and supportive care services.

This grant will be utilised in a variety of ways, ie: the cost of materials for a children's play specialist; pay for 2-3 sessions of music or art therapy; fund all of the community visits to a child in west Bletchley for a month.

Thank you for supporting us over the last year, it really does make a significant difference and grants like the one from West Bletchley Council really do help us continue making the difference when it matters the most.




REPORT TO WEST BLETCHLEY COUNCIL - WELFARE AND ESSENTIALS FUND



In March 2020 we moved into our new, state of the art building. This building has increased our capacity and significantly improves the level of support we are able to offer to residents. YMCA MK is currently home to over 200 young people and there are 14 young people on our waiting list. Our residents are among the most vulnerable young people in the City.

Upon arrival many residents, particularly those in stage 1, Supported Living, do not have items such as bedding and bed linen, bathroom essentials such as shower gel, toothbrush and paste and towel or kitchen essentials. We have used the generous funding from West Bletchley Council to purchase welcome packs for residents moving into Supported Living.

A Safer Community For 2023

Neighbourhood Watch in the Milton Keynes district hopes you can share and join in with our wish for a safer and more secure place for ourselves, our families and our communities in 2023... and here's how.

Firstly, please sign up to Neighbourhood Watch by visiting ourwatch.org.uk (click on Join us). One

massive and immediate benefit of signingup is that you also register to receive Thames Valley Police Alerts. The Alert system is used by our local Police team to alert us of major crimes, incidents,



missing people and other important appeals for vigilance and feedback in our areas. Quite simply, the more people who sign up, the more aware we are and the more opportunities we have to report back to the Police. Currently, we have approximately 13,000 residents signed up, but with your help, let's add at least another 2,023 to that!

Secondly, again through the above website, click on 'Find your local Neighbourhood Watch scheme' and enter your postcode. There's often a scheme close to you and by clicking on the actual title of the scheme you can see its map and join. By joining, you help our work promoting safer homes and communities, as well as strengthening our partnership with the Police to support us and your local area.

If there isn't a Watch scheme that covers your area then what about starting one? After you have entered your postcode, you can scroll down and click to start a new scheme. There's not a crazy amount of work to do to set up a scheme and we can help you. The reward is improving the awareness and well-being of your family and neighbours and encouraging a safer, more secure community.

GRASS AREAS BRING LEFT LONG TO SUPPORT BIODIVERSITY WITHIN THE PARISH

Spring is upon us and everything is starting to grow! In our last edition of Open Door magazine, we highlighted that we would be managing our open spaces a little differently as we move through the year.

We are continually exploring new opportunities to enhance the landscape and boost its biodiversity value. As you travel around and through the parish, you will see grass being left to grow – increasing the amount of natural habitat. As the growing season advances this will provide cover for insects when foraging and enable wildflowers to grow.









These are just a few of the areas now being naturally managed.

Whilst you're out and about, why not have a bit of fun – take a different route and see how many other locations you can identify across the parish. Enjoy!

CLIMATE CHANGE - A FOCUS ON OUR LOCAL PARKS



Our parks offer a welcome relief from the day to day grind, providing us with the opportunity to get back to nature, breathe fresh air and keep ourselves fit - Rickley Park is no exception!

Rickley Park is located at the heart of our community and is used to host West Bletchley Council events such as the annual carnival and the outdoor cinema.

WHAT'S AT RICKLEY PARK THAT MAY BE OF INTEREST TO YOU?

- Large Open Space A focal area in the centre of the parish often used for community events and by many dog walkers. There are several dog bins to be found on the perimeter path please make sure that you use them!
- Trees and Hedges there are a variety of fruiting and flowering trees located here which are a great food source for birds and pollinators. Can you tell your Malus John Downie (Crab Apple) from your Crataegus Laevigata (Midland Hawthorn). If not, have you tried the **British Trees app** from the Woodland Trust? It features an A-Z guide of trees in a free app, available for Android or iOS.







- An area for nature –In the far corner near the Rickley Lane entrance, you'll be able to see areas of grass left long to encourage insects to breed, which will then provide a food source for birds and hedgehogs. You'll also find the spring bulb garden where you can currently see tulips and striped squill which have followed on from the earlier flowering snowdrops, crocus, hyacinth and daffodils.
- A range of Exercise Equipment that's designed for all abilities, including trim trail equipment for circuit work and hydraulic resistance machines to work specific muscle groups. The perimeter path is ideal for jogging too and measures 708m or 0.44 miles per lap.

NEW ACTIVITIES AT THE CENTRE

April school break was full of fun and crafty sessions. We started with the Easter Bonnet

Competition where we were supported with judging duty by Thames Valley Police officers. The next day children could enjoy the Easter Egg Hunt by searching for the clues and answering questions to win a prize.

The following week was themed with Coronation and Carnival crafts where colourful bunting was created, and magnificent crowns produced.









Another highlight of the half term was a workshop where kids were able to interact with some exotic animals. Chinchilla, spiders, snakes, lizards and much more-everyone could touch them and face their fears. The session was led by a professional who not only allowed children to hold the animals, but also was able to capture their attention with educational talk. They learnt about the effects of environmental pollution, how they can help to improve it, and that every creature, cute or not, has massive impact on our world and its function.



INTRODUCTION

I am pleased to introduce this year's annual report which summarises West Bletchley Council's main activities and achievements during 2022/23 and our statement of accounts at the close of the financial year. We have, over the past year, continued to extend our community services to ensure that our most vulnerable residents are supported through the cost-of-living crisis. We have also extended our community programme to provide more activities and events across the parish.

In line with previous years, we have continued to allocate resources to invest in local community assets. This includes provision for the development of Chepstow Park with new pathways, play equipment and outdoor gym equipment planned for 2023.

We have continued to implement actions that seek to address Climate Change and reduce or offset our carbon footprint. This has included reducing our use of fossil fuels and implementing changes to our landscape management practices to improve biodiversity within the parish.

We have, during the past year, continued to seek to address issues that you have told us are important to you. This has included working with other agencies to address parking problems within the parish. We have

also continued to challenge proposals for development that would have a negative impact on the parish and its residents.

SUMMARY OF ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

West Bletchley Council has continued to deliver services and facilities, locally, in accordance with agreed objectives and priorities.

These priorities are reviewed and updated on a regular basis taking account of consultation with parish residents.

Residents' surveys completed during the last twelve months, continue to show good satisfaction levels in many areas. Of those who responded to the past year's postal surveys:

- 90% indicated that the way in which the Council represented residents had improved or stayed the same over the last 12 months.
- **90%** indicated that the way in which the Council communicated with residents had improved or stayed the same.
- 93%, indicated that the level of information provided by the Council had either got better or stayed the same.
- 93% agreed that facilities within the parish had either got better or stayed the same.

Feedback from our residents is an essential way of ensuring that the Council's priorities are in line with the views of our residents and that our policies and the actions we take continue to have a positive effect on the lives of those who live within the parish.

IN THE COMMUNITY

The MARC and Frank Moran Centre continue to provide a range of services, support and activities for local residents.



- The Centre offers opportunities to socialise along with easy access to computers, information and initiatives including food share, debt advice and job club. Regular activities include Franks 55+ group, arts and crafts and a weekly older people's lunch club. The Centre also hosts a programme of free community events including family discos, quiz nights and regular holiday activities.
- The Council continues to support projects which aim to address social isolation, whether of individuals or groups. Living in the Moment sessions run twice monthly at the Council offices in Whaddon Way. The West Bletchley Shed, based in Rickley Park, meets three times

a week, providing a range of activities and crafts projects.

Free counselling continues to be made available for West Bletchley residents through a partnership with the West Bletchley Wellbeing and Counselling Service.

 The Council continues to expand its annual programme of events. In addition to the Annual Carnival, 2022 highlights included a new Fun Dog Event and extended programme of Sunday Afternoon Band Concerts.

• The Council continues to fund the scheme at Bletchley Leisure Centre, which enables many West Bletchley residents, within those qualifying categories and age groups, to swim for free.

- The Council's quarterly magazine, Open Door, delivered free to every household in the parish, provides information and updates on the wide range of activities on offer.
- The Council sets aside an annual budget which is used as grant funding for local groups who need support for specific projects or purchases.

THE ENVIRONMENT

• The Council continues to work closely with its appointed landscape maintenance contractor to ensure sustainability of parks and other areas of public open space.

 West Bletchley Council continues to invest in local parks and open spaces. This has included replacing and upgrading play equipment, benches and bins as required.

- The Council continues to allocate resources towards addressing parking issues within the parish.
- West Bletchley Council remains one of few parish councils across Milton Keynes to provide free dog waste bags to residents.
- The Council continues to undertake actions to seek to address the climate emergency with a view to becoming carbon neutral by 2030 at the latest. This has included reducing the Council's use of fossil fuels, increased recycling and continued wildflowers and tree planting.
- The West Bletchley Neighbourhood Plan continues to be used to seek to ensure that development within the parish is in accordance with the views of local residents.
- West Bletchley Council continues to comment on all planning applications submitted to Milton Keynes City Council that relate to land or property situated within West Bletchley, taking account of this Council's planning policy as well as the views expressed by local residents



DOG FOULING ISSUES



Most dog owners pick up regularly after their dogs but there is a growing issue with this unpleasant and unacceptable form of litter.

There is no getting away from the fact that dog fouling – whether loose or bagged – is offensive and potentially harmful. Are you aware that contact with dog excrement can cause toxocariasis? Although rare, this nasty infection can lead to dizziness, nausea, asthma, seizures and possible blindness. To support dog owners, there are 76 dog poo bins across the parish that are regularly emptied. Use the QR code shown here to find out where they are located or visit the council's website. Poo bags are available too so there really is no excuse!

Those found not picking up after their dog can be issued with a fixed penalty notice of £100 which, if the case goes to court, will likely increase. So please, do the right thing... Bag it and bin it!


