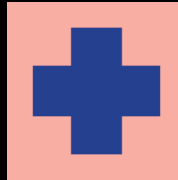
The courses are specifically designed to prepare you to complete the two stages of the OBA: NCLEX and OSCE so that you may become a working Registered Nurse within Australia.
