Along with the highly successful Sikh Educators Conference in September 2009, SikhRI launched the Sikh Educator's Network, a platform for instructors to access educational resources, and to share techniques and support. Teacher Trainings have also become more widely requested as Sojhi curriculum continues to be adopted.

Coordinating with local and national agencies, Global Awareness (GA) is SikhRI's window for interaction with the community at large through educational, media and governmental agencies.
