At the very heart of Invest Islands Foundation is the goal to **positively impact the community**. That means promoting long-term and meaningful change with all those whom we work with. That is why we donate to charities and social organizations involved in **improving access to education** and **sustaining the local environment**.

community







Education is essential in **changing communities** and **society for the better** and our aim is to provide quality education that is available for everyone. Using schools as a hub, we aim to spread positive movements by hosting a series of training workshops focused on health, waste management, and ecological issues around Lombok.

education



Education is a fundamental factor for progression in human life and should be accessible to every individual around the world. By having access to education, a person can develop the necessary skills for life and progression into a career. Education also opens paths, raises awareness about issues in the world, and increases self-awareness.

Every individual has a right to receive proper education and the Foundation strongly believes that this can be improved in many communities in undeveloped areas. We established a teaching facility and created extra-curricular educational programs for students at elementary schools in South Lombok.



We are focused on improving their quality of education by offering possibilities for **personal growth** and **cultivating proactive attitudes** and **awareness of environmental problems**. Our target beneficiary is mostly schools in remote areas.

Education

The Berajah project was primarily introduced to **support education empowerment in the community**. By providing increased access to education and higher quality equipment, the hope is that students, parents, and even teaching staff will benefit from education and employment. The aim is to provide a future to children that perhaps didn't realize a future existed.

An initiative of the Invest Islands Foundation, Bank Sampah Torok Raya, was established in 2019, operating in South Lombok with a commitment to **protecting the environment** and **educating local communities** on the importance of responsible waste management. The Bank Sampah Torok Raya project marked a milestone for the Foundation, and for Invest Islands itself. Through **female empowerment**, **education**, and **dedication**, there is no doubt that further milestone goals can be achieved.

protect



Notably, our workers in Bank Sampah Torok Raya are mostly marginalized women and widows from South Lombok. The main tasks for the local women are to work in teams of five collecting waste on Torok Beach. This waste is then transported to a recycling center where it is separated and categorized.

Regular beach cleans, a fully operational recycling center, and various educational initiatives, Bank Sampah is helping create a pilot project on coastal community-led locations, with responsible waste management strategies that can easily be replicated. Bank Sampah Torok Raya is focused on providing hands-on education for the community regarding sustainability. We have also created a recycling center that will be able to manage waste in the neighborhood at large scales.



There are a number of factors to consider when employing the waste collectors of Torok Raya. These factors must align with the Foundation's vision and strategy, but one of the requirements is that they should be female. This promotes an inclusive environment and coincides with the ethics and gender equality vision of the Foundation.

A unique reward system is implemented for the workers that focuses on essentials rather than monetary value. These rewards can include, but are not limited to, foods such as rice, vegetables, and eggs; paying electricity bills; and occasionally financial support.



The strategy is to avoid providing money to individuals and rather provide goods and services that can help sustain an entire family.

Organiika, located in Central Lombok, is an organic farm that focuses on community infrastructure. The farm was established in early 2019 and has been thriving ever since. The purpose of this organic farm is to **incorporate and encourage sustainable farming**, which in turn can produce **fresh, organic, and natural products**. Included in the harvest can be fruits, vegetables, herbs, and spices. Each of the products are organically grown and primarily used to supply the surrounding restaurants and resorts. This project focuses on promoting organic farming and sustainability to the local community by providing a learning center that distributes knowledge of permaculture and the most effective methods in organic agriculture to date.

fresh



Producing a natural fertilizer is achieved through worm composting and completes the environmentally sustainable maintenance of the farm. Throughout this process, the principles and methodology of permaculture are implemented to avoid producing any waste from the farm. The target is to create a permanent food supply through the continuation and expansion of these farming methods.

When developing Organiika, there were many important factors to take into consideration. In order to achieve the main target of sustainability for the farm, it was vital that absolutely no chemical fertilizers or pesticides were used. Instead, the farm uses environmentally safe methods of pest control. This is done through natural methods that repel the bugs without leaving harmful chemicals behind.



We aim to transfer our knowledge to local farmers and introduce them to a better, more sustainable farming method. The Organiika team are giving their all to create a healthy and organic food source for the locals to support communities and improve health. Educating farmers on these methods can expand that vision to other remote locations across the island.

Generally, men are the breadwinners of the family, for their wives and children. However, over time, this tradition has been slowly changing, shifting a conservative perspective that considers a woman's main task as a wife to stay at home and take care of domestic matters. However, this does not apply to single mothers, as various circumstances force them to take on such huge responsibilities that men would usually handle.

The expertise of the Lombok women cannot be underestimated. Some traditional crafts inherited from their ancestors are able to be mastered and used for work, which they can simultaneously do while taking care of their children, parents, and even their gardens.

Every group of local artisans has the right and the opportunity to introduce their products to a wider market, including women artisans who have been working as the breadwinners of their families. We do all this for a more prosperous life starting today, and for generations to come.

We work with more than 10 local organizations to get ahead of our mission as a whole in Lombok. We develop a collaborative approach, development a new way to ensure strategic alignment with collaborators and produce a bigger meaningful impact.

We've taken a huge part in the tree planting event in November 2021. In collaboration with Gawa Bonga Foundation, we plant more than 10.000 trees in Tumpak village and we take a role to do as much greenery as possible that is most effective and good for all. in Bongak village, we planted more than 10000 trees with local residents. This year we aim to plant ever more, not only planting the trees, we also collaborate with the locals to take a really good care for the tree till it grows nice and strong.





Did you know that the circus can be a good educational and therapeutic tool for children?. By doing some circus exercises and activities, children can improve their physical, cognitive, and social health. Making children more aware of the surrounding conditions, building core strength and selfawareness, as well as paying more attention to teamwork is an important component of the continuity of circus activities. Throughout 2021, Lombok was hit by a number of natural disasters that also caused grief, as it resulted in thousands of people having to lose their property and even the lives of their loved ones. We collaborate with governments, Rumah Senja, GNI, Pelita Foundation, Harapan Baru Lombok Indonesia, Rumah Hijau Consulting, Eco School Nusantara and other local communities to reduce the grief they face.

We invite many people to donate to help those less fortunate. there were 3 major floods that occurred in Lombok Sheet, Kuta, West Lombok.

We help in the provision of food packages, hygiene and sanitation for babies, post-flood disease prevention packages, basic necessities, school supplies and organize activities to heal their trauma from disasters.

JELAJAH JANGKOK



Jelajah Jangkok is a solution that we provide to overcome the problem of waste in the Jangkok River in Lombok that never ends. Jelajah Jangkok is a forum that will have 2 segments of target beneficiaries, children and young adults. Jelajah Jangkok is the only program with a multi-component approach that will have a maximum impact on river sustainability.

CARES



After succeeding in planting 13,000 trees last November, we collaborated with the Gawah Bonga Foundation to form a work program, namely Community-based Reforestation (CARES). We have the same vision in terms of reforestation, where forests are the lungs of the planet and have a very important role in climate change.

Together with the community, we created a larger seedbed in their local village of Dusun Bonga. The enthusiasm and initiative of all the local people around the reforestation site boosted our enthusiasm to always be committed to this reforestation project.

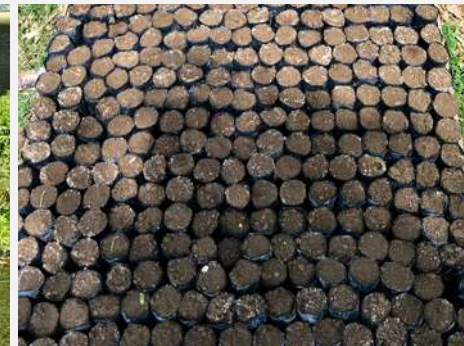
The good intentions of the community are highly appreciated and respected. They are the closest community that actively maintains the forest and takes care of it with passion and care.

GIZ & IIF

The employment promotion project ISED (Inclusive Sustainable Economic Development) as part of the G2G bilateral development cooperation between Indonesia and Germany, has been established since 2017 and will run until 2021. ISED aims to strengthen the capacities of private and public actors for promoting inclusive and sustainable employment.

Sustainable tourism has been chosen as one of the sectors ISED operates in and Lombok, Nusa Tenggara Barat as the region for the employment promotion activities in this sector.

- Research and exploration from 8 regional representatives of
 - Lombok's traditional folklore and recipe,
 - Creation of 2 books: Petualangan Anjani & Lombok, Sasak,
 - dan Masakannya,
- Impacts-driven program implementation centering the 2 books. Lesson-plan for Petualangan Anjani for school setting activities & events showcasing the recipes.





OceanKita & IIF

Ocean Kita Lombok is an effort to fight ocean plastic pollution in Lombok. This project was initiated by PT. Sustenea, a tech Company in Jakarta who seeks Invest Islands Foundation as a key player in running the project on-site.

We implement it through 3 core outputs:

- Carrying out educational campaigns to coastal communities around Mandalika
- Installation and operation of the 1T / 2 T trawl-net to overcome floating marine debris in Mandalika
- Replicate and scale up the project in other areas in Lombok.





LOMBOK WASTE COLLECTIVE

Lombok waste collective is a communal effort to establish a responsible waste management strategy in South Lombok. This project was initiated by Invest Islands Foundation and Black Soldier Flies Lombok.

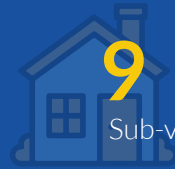
