1. ARMS LEGISLATION BILL

2. PODIATRIST BOARD PROPOSAL

1. Submissions are being called on the <u>Arms Legislation Bill</u>. This omnibus Bill introduces tighter controls on the use and possession of arms and ammunition and follows on from the Arms (Prohibited Firearms, Magazines, and Parts) Amendment Act. It would re-state the purpose of the Arms Act to make it clear that owning a firearm is a privilege, and that people with that privilege have a responsibility to act in the interests of personal and public safety.


As an organisation our focus in on page 3 of the Bill namely:

"... Health Practitioners will have a responsibility to consider notifying Police if, after seeing or being consulted about a patient, they consider the person should not be permitted to use or possess firearms or should only do so subject to limitations that may be warranted by their mental or physical condition. Part o this notification will include and assessment of whether they believe the person poses a risk of harm to themselves or to others. Licence holders may then be required to undergo a further medical assessment or surrender their licence. To assist with this, applicants for firearms must provide contact details for their health practitioner to Police.arms legislation bill..."

2. The Podiatrist's Board is <u>consulting on a proposal</u> that will enable appropriately trained podiatrists to prescribe from a list of medicines relevant to their clinical practice including: a limited range of analgesics, antibacterials, antifungals, corticosteroids, parasiticidal preparations, emollients and local anaesthetics.

ZANTAC PHARMACY LEVEL RECALL

GlaxoSmithKline (GSK) NZ Limited has initiated a pharmacy level recall for all batches of ZANTAC Solution for Injection 25 mg/mL in New Zealand. *Please note this is not a patient level recall.*

Global GSK has been contacted by regulatory authorities regarding the detection of genotoxic nitrosamine (NDMA) in medicines containing ranitidine. NDMA is a potential carcinogen that is commonly found in some foods, air and water. There is a small risk that NDMA may cause cancer if taken long term, however there is no known immediate health risk associated with ranitidine medicines*.

GSK has made the decision to initiate a recall (pharmacy level recall) of Zantac products manufactured using active pharmaceutical ingredient (API) sourced from Saraca Laboratories Limited and Dr Reddy's Limited as a precautionary action. This recall affects Zantac Injection in New Zealand.

The recall is effective 30 September 2019.



ROAD SAFETY: RESPONSE TO CHANGES IN MEDICATION FUNDING

Pharmac has recently announced there will be changes to funded brands of Epilepsy Medication, **effective 1 October 2019** .

The Transport Agency's primary concern is road safety and want to share their position on this with health professionals.

"The Transport Agency's primary concern is road safety, and while we will not be

enforcing a mandatory stand-down period from driving as we do when licence holders undergo a withdrawal of treatment, as a precaution we will be recommending that health practitioners whose patients have or will be transferring brands consider a voluntary stand down from driving during the eight-week early transition period after switching medications, should they have any concerns when considering an individual patient's medical history and other relevant factors. "

"Additionally, we encourage anyone with concerns about the potential side effects as a consequence of changing brands to consult with their health practitioner or specialist before continuing to drive. Health professionals are often best placed to make a determination in respect of a person's driving ability, by considering the patient's medical history and other relevant factors that may only be known by their health practitioner."



Are you employing new staff?

The Employment Relations Act sets out a process that an employer must follow when employing new staff. This process differs depending on whether the employer uses a collective employment agreement in their business or not, and whether the employee is a union member. The NZMA has a member resource on these processes.

Also, all employees must have a written employment agreement. If you employ staff that are not covered under the Primary Health Care Multi Employer Collective Agreement (PHC MECA) we have a generic individual employment agreement with explanatory notes and a casual individual employment agreement.
