

Cornell University Academic Position Outreach and Information Services Librarian

Cornell University is seeking an **Outreach and Information Services Librarian** to support incarcerated college students; we are looking for someone who will collaborate within and outside of Cornell University to improve academic scholarship opportunities of incarcerated students. This is an exciting opportunity to join <u>Cornell's Olin & Uris Libraries</u>, in collaboration with the <u>Cornell Prison Education Program</u>, at a pivotal moment of growth in Cornell's in-prison college program. Within the library's innovative and collaborative culture, the selected candidate will have a driver's seat role in developing information services for incarcerated students in prisons near the Ithaca Campus of Cornell University.

Merging the world-class library of Cornell University with the rapidly developing field of higher education, this person will have the support to actively participate in local and national discussions relating to the access, retrieval, and expansion of information resources for incarcerated students. Cornell University is an Ivy League research university with strong commitments to diversity, inclusion, non-discrimination, antiracism, and diversity of perspectives on all issues. The university's in-prison degree-granting programs operate in partnership with the state correctional system, but also seeks to challenge punitive incarceration and reimagine the possibility for change and transformation in the criminal justice system.

We welcome candidates from a variety of backgrounds, including if you are new to the library profession or bring non-library instructional experience. We want you to have some familiarity with information services, but more importantly enthusiasm for building more experience on the job.

- Receive individualized mentorship in outreach and information services and higher education in prison (HEIP) specifically to support your career goals.
- Collaborate with internal and external partners to develop long-term solutions in supporting non-traditional learners at Cornell University.

- Acquire practical hands-on experience with the use of information resources, instructional pedagogy, and library delivery systems while supporting the scholarship and learning of incarcerated students on-site in the prisons.
- Contribute to building a body of knowledge at the intersection of high education in prison, academic libraries and learning pedagogies.
- Support for professional development inside and outside of the CUL community.

Work Location:

This position is located in Ithaca, New York. The successful applicant will be expected to work on the Ithaca campus and inside correctional facilities affiliated with the Cornell Prison Education Program.

Required Qualifications:

- Experience in research, teaching, or librarianship in a four-year academic degree program.
- Knowledge of how racism, sexism, and poverty affect learning and success in education and the ways in which power affects the human experience.
- Demonstrated experience applying new solutions to age-old challenges, comfort with failure and willingness to engage in iterative problem solving.
- The ability to acquire and maintain security clearance to work in prison.
- A valid driver's license and the ability to drive to prison locations.
- A Masters or PhD degree.

This is a full-time three-year term appointment with the possibility for renewal, contingent upon successful performance and available funding. The anticipated academic rank for this position is Assistant Librarian or Senior Assistant Librarian, with an anticipated salary range of \$52,500-\$60,000.
