STANDARDS OF QUALITY

POTTERY

Materials

- 1. Clay must be free from defects, and appropriate to the function and expected durability of the finished article.
- 2. Glazes must meet Health Canada requirements.

Technique

- 1. Each piece should be executed so that it is evenly thrown or constructed, well balanced and of consistent proportions throughout, unless the design requires otherwise.
- 2. Each piece must be properly trimmed and finished.
- 3. Bottoms should be smooth and flat, with any roughness removed.
- 4. Ceramic pieces must be free of cracks and warpage.
- 5. Glazes should be evenly applied and pieces fired with no signs of crazing, pitting or pinholing, unless otherwise intended.
- 6. Functional pieces must meet expectations for performance: spouts must pour without dripping; handles and lids must fit and function well.
- 7. Cast works in clay are acceptable if the master, the mold and the casting are the work of a craftsperson. The use of commercial molds is permitted only if the mold is so neutral as to have no influence on the aesthetic of the finished piece. Surface decoration must:
 - 1. Show a high level of understanding and application of design principles
 - 2. Be original, and show the distinct, personal style of the maker
 - 3. Show that consideration has been given to the integration of the base form into the finished product
 - 4. Be consistent with other products that form part of the craftsperson's line.
- 8. The use of decals on pottery cast from commercial molds is not permitted.
- * Regulations: There are very specific regulations concerning the production and glazing of ceramic products. Craftspeople should obtain copies of pertinent regulations from Health Canada.
