Ministry Team Letter

How do you see it??

It might seem to you as though the best of the year has already gone - the longest day, the hottest weather, the best barbecues.... I'm sure you know people who are already saying things like 'the days will get shorter now' and 'the kids will be back to school soon'..... Maybe your holiday already seems like a distant memory! Yet as I sit in the garden today, the sun is shining through the leaves still on the trees, still green, still beautiful, and I am reminded of the words of CS Lewis, engraved on his memorial tombstone: 'I believe in Christianity as I believe that the sun has risen. Not only because I see it, but because by it I see everything else.'

The way we look at the world is through the lenses that are part of us - our culture, upbringing, education... all have a part to play. For me, the most important lens I use is my faith in Jesus Christ. It isn't brought out on Sundays only. It is part of me; it impacts the choices I make and how I live my life day to day. It helps me decide what is really important, what truly matters. The way my faith is expressed has varied a lot over the years and is about to change again!

You will all know that Rev Emma has moved to the cathedral for a year and also that Rev Dave is moving on after the summer. Archdeacon Claire Wood has been helping us find out how we can rise to the challenge of being 21st century church and understand what God wants us to be involved in for this time. So what it looks like is this: -

There will always be a clergy person available who can manage our provision for important life events like weddings. They will be available some of the time for Sunday services too, but we will be looking at how we can help more local lay people be involved in worship for themselves and others. For example, world-wide in the Church of England, some 50,000 people now worship on other days and at different times in what are known as 'Fresh Expressions of Church'. And in our own Diocese of Leicester, these are the words from Bishop Martyn 'Fresh expressions of church offer us a living model of what can happen when God's people are set free to be leaders in mission, when clergy and lay work in partnership, with a genuine sharing of gifts and true mutuality.'

This idea of shared responsibility is being put into practice here in our area. Leadership provision around Mission, Vision, Clusters and PCCs will be led by a new appointment - Stephen March will be joining us for 3 days a week from September. He has extensive church leadership experience in rural areas, and as part of his current role within the Mission & Ministry department of the diocese, he has encouraged and supported churches as they rethink how they work with all those around to see community grow and flourish where they live.

So, all change!! How do you see it? Is your 'lens' making you wish for the past, angry with the present, or fearful for the future? Or are you, like me, excited about the possibilities and the potential for growth?



THE VILLAGE NEIGHBORHOOD PLAN - CAN YOU HELP?

We are having a drop in / open evening meeting on Tuesday September 17 in the pub from 5 - 9pm to persuade people to "volunteer" to help.

At the original village planning open day and in the questionnaire, local villagers identified a range of issues where they wanted to see change. Nothing will happen to these issues unless people come forward to offer to get involved. The Parish Council recognizes it has responsibility to drive this change, but it is a very small committee and so needs your help.

The things that people wanted to change included

- improving the village hall
- using our lovely church more often
- sorting out parking in some areas of the village
- creating a new "green" space / village green /pocket park
- having better cycle and footpath linkages, and circular dog walking path around the village

A few people, myself included, have volunteered to sort this initial scoping meeting in September, with the backing of the Parish Council. The Parish Council will have overall responsibility for this work and have access to some funds. Some groups eg Village Hall Committee, Parochial Church Council and the School may also need to take the lead for some action.

BIRDS AT STANFORD RESERVOIR – JANUARY TO MID JULY 2019

So we finished 2018 having recorded 137 different species for the reservoir – a pretty good effort but the New Year always brings new optimism of what might turn up. This short review covers the period from January to the 18th July.

Gulls!

I know this might not sound particular exciting but over recent years the checking of the roosting gulls has been neglected a little. This is partly down to observer coverage and also due to the fact that "gulling" means standing around for an hour or two, close to dusk on cold Autumn or Winter evenings and working your through a "white mass" looking for something unusual. Over recent years, Stanford should have benefited from the huge gathering of gulls at the nearby Cotesbach Landfill site, which can attract up to 20,000 birds in good years. However, a significant proportion of these choose to roost at the larger Draycote Water but I thought it was worth investing some time.

The gulling started well with a surprise find in the middle of the day on the 12th January when I discovered a Glaucous Gull, the first at the site since 2004. This bird was also seen at both Cotesbach and Draycote on subsequent dates and did also return to Stanford several times. On the 17th whilst checking the gull roost, an Iceland Gull was discovered. A bird only recorded 4 times in the last 19 years – a really good start to the gull season with two of the specialties already notched up.

On the 18th February I discovered a Mediterranean Gull in the roost. This is the first time we have had this species since 2017. Following this sighting I also had Med Gulls on at least 3 other occasions during the winter.

In March I found a Kittiwake (the first since 2015). Sadly this bird only stayed for a few minutes but I did manage to get some images which can be viewed on the Stanford Ringing Group website.

Finally, on gulls, we had a fantastic 16 Little Gulls drop into the reservoir over a few days during April – always a great bird to have visiting.

Birds of Prey

One of the highlights of the winter was a female Hen Harrier, which spent 109 days around the reservoir but was still quite elusive at times. In addition, we have had Merlin, Osprey, Hobby, Kestrel, Buzzard and Sparrowhawk. We have also done pretty well with Owls - Short-eared, Barn, Tawny and 2 incredible records of Long-eared Owl (the first for 19 years) all recorded so far.

Warblers

As always we have done really well with these summer visitors. Really good numbers of Reed Warblers have been present and in the last few days we have proof that Grasshopper Warbler has bred again. On spring and summer mornings the reservoir is alive with bird song from the vast array of warbler species including Sedge Warbler, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Willow Warbler, Chiffchaff, Cetti's Warbler, Blackcap and Garden Warbler.

Waders

Sadly we don't have any exposed mud this year so our main opportunity to see waders are birds that decide to settle on the dam or feed on the new spillway at the dam end. Despite the lack of a suitable habitat we

So far we have recorded Greenshank, Redshank, Oystercatcher, Dunlin, Sanderling, Ringed Plover, Little Ringed Plover, Curlew, Whimbrel, Lapwing, Green Sandpiper and Common Sandpiper — all on the dam! Away from here Snipe, Woodcock, Golden Plover and Jack Snipe have been recorded. So, a pretty good selection of species with (hopefully) a few more possible before the end of the year.

Other Birds

Other species of note so far in 2019 include Great Egret, Little Egret, Kingfisher, Tree Pipit, Wheatear, Ring Ouzel, Black Tern, Arctic Tern, Pink-footed Goose, White-fronted Goose, Common Scoter and Whooper Swan.

So the list for 2019 currently stands at 140, 3 more than last year with 5½ months to go. A big thanks to the Ringing Group, regular birders and visitors for all the sightings.

RASPBERRY GIN / LIQUEUR

Should you happen to have a surfeit of raspberries and like flavoured gins then this is a simple and tasty use of them.

Use a large kilner jar 1-2 litres to make this in.

Put 900 – 1400g (2-3lb) of raspberries in the jar.

Add 200 – 300g of white caster sugar and

Strips of lemon zest

Shake the jar

Add gin 750 – 1000ml

Shake again

Leave in a dark dry place for a month, shaking occasionally

Strain through a sieve and then a muslin / coffee filter

Keep in bottles for a month before drinking.



Don't throw the raspberries away but use as boozy raspberries with icecream.

The recipe above can be adapted to suit the fruit and alcohol you have / like. Strawberries and vodka can be interchanged with the raspberries and gin.

This can be drunk neat as a liqueur or with tonic to make a long drink.

Alternatively the liqueur can be poured over icecream. If it lasts that long it can be a pleasant reminder of summer.

Parish Council Procedures:

KB to liaise with previous clerk, and any other relevant bodies, re handover and 'catching up' with back log, after the six months absence of a parish clerk.

PA in process of setting up online banking facility with Natwest and the PC completed the form to apply for this facility.

Solar Farm Proposal:

Chris Angell from Vattenfall attended the meeting with the purpose of introducing himself to the council, and having a brief discussion to outline the proposed plan to build a solar farm on land to the north of the existing Swinford wind farm. He showed the council a plan of where the solar farm would be situated, and said that, in his opinion, generally, solar farms have less of an environmental impact on the area involved, than a wind farm.

Chris explained that they are at 'pre-planning' stage at the moment, and hope to talk to all the neighbouring parishes. He suggested arranging a presentation, perhaps in August, this year, so that any interested parties would be able to attend, and have any questions answered. PA pointed out that he would have to allow time for the article to be published in at least two months' editions of the South Kilworth News, so perhaps September was more realistic.

Chris said that they would hope to have a planning decision from HDC by the end of the year, three months after they've submitted their application. If all goes ok, they could possibly begin work on site, in the middle of next year. They expect the time involved in the construction of the site to be a matter of months, a fairly quick build.

PA thanked Chris for coming to the meeting and explaining the proposal.
