


It was a good night for all where the Consultant was able to suggest our own individual colour classification, eg cool or warm based on a combination of an individual's skin tone and eye and hair colour.

Stanford Reservoir Birds

The initial period since my last article proved to be pretty slow going but things picked up towards the end of May and into June.

Most of the summer migrants are now fully into their breeding cycle. We have again been blessed with the return of Cuckoos – at least 4 have been seen, including 2 females and they continue to be pretty active as I write this article. Garden Warblers seem to be doing particularly well with a number of singing birds around the site. One noticeable absence is that of the Grasshopper Warbler – there seem to be reasonable numbers around the county but for some reason, they have missed us so far.

Purple Patch

Birding started to pick up on the 27th May with the first Greenshank of the year which flew through calling but unfortunately didn't stop. On the 28th an Osprey flew in and stayed for around 5 minutes before heading off – this is only the second record of the year. The following day delivered a Black Tern which stayed around most of the afternoon. The last day of the month delivered more waders – our second Greenshank of the year on



the dam and the small pool at the inlet end. Also, 2 Sanderling with the second one showing very well on the dam and spillway. These were the first records since 2021.

The first day of June delivered one of the biggest surprises of the year so far. With very limited time I did a quick early morning check from the dam and was rewarded with a group of 13 Common Scoters (the sea duck that I wrote about in my last article). This is quite an unusual time of year as these birds should be on their breeding grounds by now. The group was made up of 3 males and 10 females and is the largest group I have recorded at the reservoir. The birds stayed all day, often doing short

flights around the reservoir. Later on in the day, 8 Black Terns arrived with one staying into the following day and was later joined by 3 more – an excellent year so far for this species.



The 2nd June delivered a visitor from Poland. A Common Tern with a white leg flag 'FME' which was ringed in Gdansk Port on the 9th July 2020 and this was the first time the bird had been reported in the UK. The following day another Common Tern, this time with a yellow colour ring was present.



This one was ringed in London in June 2020 and was the first time the bird had been reported since being ringed.

On the 7th June, I found a Marsh Warbler near the Leicestershire reedbed, the rarest bird of the year so far. The bird was very tricky to see but could be identified from its wonderful song which contains a lot of mimicry of other birds including the Great Tit, Blackbird, Song Thrush and Hose Sparrow! It stayed for the whole day and was still singing late into the evening. A number of visiting birders enjoyed the warbler with one even finding a singing Golden Oriole, another rare bird for the county. The Marsh Warbler is the 9 th ever record for Leicestershire and Rutland and is the first one to be found since 1990!

- 2. July or August is a good time to summer prune Wisteria by cutting back the whippy summer growth to contain the plant. Wisteria is vigorous and needs harsh treatment.
- 3. Get new strawberry plants for free by planting up the runners.
- 4. By August once the birds have finished nesting you can safely prune hedges.
- 5. Trim lavender after flowering.

SPF what you need to know in a nutshell – Bliss & Beauty Tips

SPF in your moisturiser isn't great. You also need to reapply your spf so do you really want to keep reapplying your expensive moisturiser? If your skin starts to turn pink after 10 minutes in the sun, your spf 15 will protect you for 15 times the amount your skin protects you, so 15 x 10


minutes before you redden. So SPF 15 will protect you for 150 minutes and factor 50 can protect you for 500 minutes. So higher is better right??? Not really. Factor 50 can lead you into a false sense of security and it can often be loaded with chemicals. These act as free radicals that don't do any favours to your skin. One application isn't enough of any spf. You're meant to reapply every two hours, even water-resistant ones. Using an SPF 50 means we also don't look at other effective means of protection without the chemical element, such as shade and hats. You also need your SPF to be broad-spectrum. This means that it protects from both UVA and UVB rays. Buy a good one and wear it all year round. Does SPF prevent us from getting the vitamin D element from the sun?


Yes, it does. We need about 10 minutes in the sun without an SPF on to get the best from the sun's good bits. Regular SPF can help protect against the formation of pigmentation but it's not a guarantee. Pigmentation can be formed from light shining into our eyes, so with the best will in the world, even the very best SPF isn't going to stop that! Once we have pigmentation marks we need to protect all year round because although the UVA light that is around us all the time doesn't cause pigmentation, it can cause existing pigmentation to darken! I treat a lot of sun-damaged skin and think "this is avoidable". So in a nutshell: aim for a good quality broad Spectrum SPF of 15 – 30; apply every two hours if out in the sun; use a hat and sunglasses for extra protection; add makeup with an SPF for added protection; and remember, as soon as you start to turn brown, the damage is being done. It's your body trying to protect itself. Have a great and safe summer, **Vicki Hart**
