How Shall We Be?

Knowing when to open our church again has been one of the most trying and difficult struggles of our lives together as a body. It's easy to say, "We'll ask of the Lord and know." Yes, we believe that, and in my knowing, the Lord has not asked us to close down at all. Quite to the contrary. He's always called us to live by faith in Him. But Caesar is the problem.

We have a whirlwind of information and mandates coming at us from those in authority. Our state and federal governments by their words and power have closed our society. Christians are sorely divided on keeping our churches open. Confusion reigns, and we know where this comes from, "for God is not a God of confusion but of peace, as in all the churches of the saints" (1 Cor.14.33).

The evil one wants to confuse us; divide and conquer. We should see the devil's fingerprints all over this virus scare and the draconian measures put upon us. We're being soften up for the next crisis and the next advance of evil men on our freedoms.

We must remember that the Bible teaches us that we're "free in Christ" (Gal. 5.1). It teaches us, "let no man deceive you..." (2 Thess.2.3).
