<u>Free Again</u>

Freedom should have a new meaning for us now that we're back in church. What we took for granted before the virus lock-down, is now far more precious. Now, we have a taste of what it's like to be denied freedom of religion and the right of assembly, which are guaranteed by our constitution.

What's disturbing is that we so easily gave away these rights.

Reading Christian history reminds us that Jesus' church has been maligned, persecuted, and outlawed since the beginning. Believer's learned to meet in secret, to network together inconspicuously, and to continue in their faith without fear. So, we have done that in this season.

We should get a clue from Jesus' teachings about our status in the world: "...If they persecuted Me, they will also persecute you..." (John 15.20b). Jesus also taught: "But I say to you, love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you" (Matt.5.44). Key to this is praying for those who have so easily closed our churches.

We're at war here in case you haven't noticed. It's a war between God and the evil one, who first rebelled against Him (Rev.12.7ff). We are "unwilling, noncombatant participants" in this on-going global conflict. Every day we believers must choose sides, and in choosing, we will be persecuted.

Jude writes: "...contend earnestly for the faith which was once for all delivered to the saints" (Jude 3). Yes, we need to contend for our faith without being "contentious." In the midst of persecution, we are to be "good news," not bad news, to a lost world.

So, how will we believers be in the next national "emergency?"

Pray the Lord the wisdom and grit to persevere.
