Sustainable Coastlines Hawai'i (SCH) is a grassroots nonprofit organization whose **mission is to inspire communities to care for coastlines.** We accomplish this by organizing fun and engaging community beach cleanup events, sharing place-based culturally rooted knowledge through a robust educational program, promoting awareness through public outreach campaigns, engaging business leadership in hands-on solutions through corporate cleanups, providing the tools needed for others to host their own cleanups, and offering sustainability consulting and resource recovery services at events.

To date, SCH has reached nearly 45,000 students with educational content and has removed over 700,000 lbs of debris from Hawai'i's coastlines with the help of over 50,000 volunteers. SCH strives to continue to grow its impact and fulfill its vision of a world filled with inspired people, clean beaches, and healthy coastlines.

POSITION SUMMARY

The Action Pillar of Sustainable Coastlines Hawai'i consists of the on-the-ground, hands-on programs that bring SCH closer to their vision of a world of inspired people, clean beaches, and healthy coastlines. As of 2024 the main components of the Action Pillar center on the Cleanups & Restoration Program and the Resource Recovery Program. These programs have a variety of subprograms that also fall within the programmatic areas. The subprograms include Large-scale cleanups, corporate cleanups, DIY cleanups, small-kine cleanups, marine debris rapid response (archived, but could return with heavy debris loads and additional staff capacity), Resource Recovery and event sustainability services, and composting (collaboratively run with Director of Development and SustainEvents team).

The Action Manager will be responsible for managing coordinators and interns to develop innovative/proactive solutions to plastic pollution, waste management, and coastal resilience. The Action Manager will also be responsible for the overall success of two main programs: the "SustainEvent Resource Recovery Program" and the "Cleanups and Restoration Program", with the support of the Director of Development. The Action Manager will report to the Executive Director and work very closely with the Director of Development and other members of the leadership team.

Note: This job description is not intended to be all-inclusive. Employee may perform other related duties as negotiated to meet the ongoing needs of the organization.

The WHAT of the Job:

Key Responsibilities for the Action Pillar Include:

- Program Management: The Action Manager will be responsible for overseeing the day-to-day
 operations of the "Resource Recovery Program" and the "Cleanups and Restoration Program",
 ensuring that the programs are meeting their goals and objectives. This includes managing
 coordinators and interns, managing logistics, and overseeing program implementation.
- Resource Recovery Program Support the composting program, including logistics, communications, and miscellaneous program partner support.
- Sustain Events Oversee contract fulfillment, event logistics, and client communications for Sustain Events, working closely with the Director of Development.
- Systems Management Storage Systems Oversight: Collaborate with the Action Coordinators & Director of Engagement on storage systems oversight for cleanups and Sustain Events.
- Execute project development and day-to-day operations for solutions center management in Kahuku.
- Project Development Collaborate with the Director of Development on the development and implementation of new projects within the Action Pillar and assist in program budget management and tracking.
- People Leadership Provide leadership and mentorship for the Action team (3 coordinators and 2-3 interns), working closely with the Executive Director.
- Conduct regular progress check-ins, offer directional support, and participate in employee reviews and goal setting.
- Lead the Action team in coordinating program activities while incorporating organizational values and cross-cutting initiatives at all levels.
- Works to build long-term relationships in culturally rich and diverse spaces and manages ongoing pilina with those people and places.
- Nalu through challenging situations, navigating and balancing relationships with strong leadership skills. Relationships will be largely within rural communities and will also include agency employees and partner organizations.
- Manages the volunteer program, managing and supporting the action and inspiration coordinators in volunteer team recruiting and management.
